

Remarks on board Ship Goos Group Capt. Ash

Saturday May 26<sup>th</sup> 1864

commenced push from the old working to the  
middle part thick fog being about  
the part much like the fog that

Sunday May 27<sup>th</sup> 1864

commenced push from the old ship under  
storing to the wind working to the old  
at 2 PM came up to the ice to the ship  
stood off at a small with the Euphrates and  
and later part strong saw the Sea Head Cape  
Lewis Lawrence at a distance. down sail in  
sight. it ends with snow

Monday May 28<sup>th</sup> 1864

commenced push from the old ship under  
up to the wind of the ice  
at 1 PM gained with the Eliza Adams at 4  
a boat came along side from the ship  
at the other middle and latter part  
Eliza Adams in sight and not all gained  
a little snow

Long 172 N 37 E

Tuesday May 29<sup>th</sup>

commenced light working through the  
ice heading to the old ship. the ice is quite  
open the main land in sight gained  
with the Juliana & Park Richmond  
Capt Hall. middle part light laying  
back in the water. at 6 PM comm  
enced to work back to the southward

Wednesday June 1<sup>st</sup> 1864

commenced light working to the old  
at 4 PM went out of the ice gained to do  
with the Euphrates Eliza Adams George  
and Park Richmond. middle part  
light latter part moderate

in the Bherind Sea amongst the ice

Thursday June 2<sup>nd</sup> 1864

commenced moderate push from the old ship  
at working to the eastward. about 3 PM gained  
with the Thomas Dickson Cape Stewart. at 4 PM  
and the latter part push

Friday June 3<sup>rd</sup> 1864

commenced push from the old ship under  
last sail. ice to the windward. middle and latter  
part thick fog with a little snow. the rigging  
covered with snow. at 2 PM light & main top sail  
Saw 172 N 46 E

Saturday June 4<sup>th</sup> 1864 Lat 52 N 45 E

commenced moderate & foggy at 4 gained with  
the Ship Europa 212 from Boston. saw the  
gained with the Park Lamerlain. middle  
and latter part thick and strong breeze from  
N.E. at 4 PM the Euphrates & gained the courses  
latter part gained with the Europa again  
Ship under double reefed topsails & courses

Sunday June 5<sup>th</sup> 1864

commenced push wind from the old ship during  
the middle part of the night. both courses at  
working to the old ship. gaining the fore part  
with the Europa. latter part push sailing up  
through the ice several ships in sight to the  
windward so ends

Monday June 6<sup>th</sup> 1864

commenced push from the old ship, working  
to the old ship. down sail in sight. middle part  
push latter part moderate. in the ice

Tuesday June 7<sup>th</sup>

commenced light working to the old ship  
gained with the Park Crocker middle  
part light latter part moderate working  
to the southward going out of the ice
