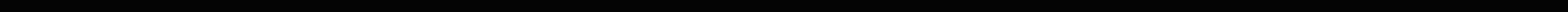

Wednesday Thursday Jan. 26 & 25

fine weather and light air up of the point

Thursday Friday January 24th/63. 26

fine & light air, the boat of whaling, at 8 A.M.
hoisted up and went down the coast, at 5 P.M.
looked up the boat of boat of Margareta by
no where there an old Frenchman coming out

Sa Friday January 27

fine weather & moderate breeze, employed in ship
duty. This day is lat-12 hours long. Civil
Nautical Time Lat 23.26 Long 94.16

Saturday February 26

commenced firing about S.E. by E. at 6 1/2
a Steamer passed us bound down the coast. Three men
letters on board but they threw them back again
we obtained two before from the steamer, - middle
of latter part light. The latter part consisted
chasing Black Hills. Miss boat struck but drew

Sunday January 29th 163

commenced with a light air, at 2 P.M. the
sloop boat went ashore, at 6 brought the
ship to anchor in 13 fathoms of water
at Cape St. Louis. middle and taller from
great light.

Monday January 30th

commissioned a boatman, went ashore and had
a room for the night. The latter part, getting
of wind, the man worked during the
night.

Monday January 31st / 65.

June 9, 1868. Spent the fore noon getting
of recreation. Went out of about one hour a goat
I had your meat, cheese, at 25.16 caught the water
at 7.10 hope up and went to sea with a light
in of shore, so sent Lot 22, 40, & Log 185-6.
