

Remarks on board Ship Congress

Sunday March 12th/65

commenced light from the S. Ed. steering S. by E. at 11.30 A.M. single reefed the main sail. on account of steering the ship at 2.30 P.M. lost sight of the Congress. The old Troop having run her out of sight. Latitude 08° 45' N Longitude 123° 27' W

Monday March 13th/65

commenced light from the S. Ed. heading along a little to the southward of N. middle & latter part much like the fore part. Lat 08° 45' N Long 123° 40' W

Tuesday March 14th/65

these twenty four hours commenced with a light breeze from the S. Ed. at 1.30 P.M. raised a sail on the starboard beam. at 4.30 P.M. gained the Ship & Congress Cape Castine middle & latter part much like the fore part. at 10 P.M. these twenty four hours carrying all sail at night. Lat 08° 16' N Longitude 129° 48' W

Wednesday March 15th/65

commenced light & continued so through these twenty four hours. the fore part gained with the Congress. at 1 P.M. the fore part repairing studding sails. Lat 08° 35' N Long 125° 22' W

Thursday March 16th/65

commenced with light breeze. steering N. by W. sail set. wind from the Eastward at 3 P.M. but the studding sails were taken in & lowered. studding sail. Latitude 2° 41' N Longitude 126° 31' W

Friday March 17th/65

commenced light from the Eastward steering N. by W. (or S. by E. N. E.) latter part squally with rain. fore part much like the rigging. at 10 P.M. these twenty four hours

Saturday March 18th/65

commenced with light breeze. sail from the the Eastward. middle & latter part moderate steady. Latitude 08° 47' N Longitude 126° 31' W

Sunday March 19th/65

commenced with a moderate breeze from the S. Ed. steering S. by E. at 11.30 A.M. single reefed the main sail. on account of steering the ship at 2.30 P.M. lost sight of the Congress. The old Troop having run her out of sight. Latitude 08° 45' N Longitude 123° 27' W
