Arrived at Hilo March 21st 1865

Remarks on board Ship Gov. Troy

Tuesday March 21st 1865

commenced with fog the S.E. all sail set
during 11 A.M. at 1 P.M. raised the East
sail of Uagha at 6 o'clock in the light
sails & left the harbor. Being of
9 on during the night. at 4 A.M. bent the
cables & put the anchors of the bar.

Note I had made this day 26 hours long. about 10 M. came
to anchor in Hilo in about 6 fathoms of water.
the Bark Seabell being then 40 hours of delay.

Hilo Thursday April 6th 1865. 12 hours long
There 12 hours is the first part of Thursday Civil time or
rather first Pacific time
commenced with a light and breeze at 2 P.M. till
the Bkr came on board. later at 9 P.M. sail &
went to sea the Bkr carrying us about 6 A.M. about
4 o'clock the sea breeze with first fresh breeze.

Friday April 7th Pacific time
commenced with a light breeze all sail set
rounding the island of Uagha. at 4 P.M. bent
on the forest. just as much wind as we could
carry mainmast to right before the wind. at 8
Ship under double reef (sails) about 6.45 P.M.

night. middle part the 2nd part of the
