

Remarks on board Ship for Group Port of

Monday October 30th/65

commenced steaming from the Eastward bearing S.W. at 10 AM. at 11 AM. the wind, heading S.W. at 10 AM. at 11 AM. the middle part steering about - W. took the Pilot of the ship about 1.15 till came to anchor about 2 or 3 miles off in the Bay of Hilo. then being the ship Eliza Adams the vessel Black Robert from Honolulu. I received 6 seals of the group.

October 31

Tuesday November 1st/65

commenced steaming and continued at through the day during the night it rained all night. Employed washing ship inside and getting of a cargo of water to night with 29 to 40.

Wednesday Nov 2nd/65

employed washing ship outside at 2 PM sent the boat in shore to get some shocks read to take on board. Fine weather for Hilo. First 3 seals of the group started for the Volcano this morning.

Thursday November 3rd/65

commenced pleasant. employed getting of shocks & four shock head cask. no rain to day. Received three letters to day from C.F. & one from Hilo. Ship ready for sea at 5 PM.

Friday November 4th/65 3rd

Beautiful weather all day, sent the old boat ashore to day, at 5 PM several passengers came on board to go to Honolulu right as among the number was the doctor of the ship. The snow ship all ready for sea after part heavy rain.

Saturday November 5th/65

commenced rain. about 2 PM the Captain came back from the Volcano, at 6 PM the Captain came on board, at 9 PM the passengers were asked if the sea breeze had come and no chance to go to sea to day. During the latter part of the (long) Black Robert from Honolulu to sea at 1 PM the passengers came on board again.

Sunday November 6th/65

commenced raining at 12 midnight the ship came on board called all hands made all sail and the boat ashore after the Captain at 3.40 PM rose up and went to sea with a very light breeze of S.W. of the East end of Hawaii. The boat put from the Hilo Bay.

Monday November 6th/65

commenced with a moderate breeze from the N.E. at 10 AM. at 11 AM. the middle part steering to the S.W. the Black Robert from Honolulu a short distance astern, at 1 PM. the weather end of Hilo, at 1.30 PM took in the light sail, away up to the weather end of Hilo at 9 PM left to of Oahu head.

Tuesday November 7th/65

took the Pilot at 6.30 till the Steamer at 1.30 came to anchor in Honolulu. Employed about 9 till, received one letter to day, employed the remainder of the day drying. One M.S. Laraine left this morning for Hilo, carrying the Hawaiian mail.

Wednesday Nov 8th

employed drying and bunching in, one boat to Hilo land to day & Mrs. Dixon of Australia.

Thursday Nov 9

fine weather, employed 10 Kanakas to day, loaded ship along side of the wharf to and commenced to discharge oil.

Friday November 10th/65

employed discharging oil. fine weather.

Saturday November 11th/65

fine weather, discharging oil in the Port of Hilo.

Sunday November 12

commenced with fresh trade, all hands ashore for one boat to look out for the ship.

Monday November 13th/65

Tuesday November 14th/65 employed discharging oil, latter part home. at night all out and hauled off.

Wednesday November 15

fresh trade, employed making out the gas hole so as to let ship. First 4 seals of the group sailed to day in the Empress for Hilo.
