

Sailed from Kibo I. April 11th 1866

Wednesday April 11th

at 4 A.M. commenced to get underway, light land breeze, lowered four hours, looking all the time, came to anchor about 10 M. just outside of the reef, boat went ashore, came back about 7 P.M.

Thursday April 12th 1866

Commenced with blowing winds of shore, called at hands about 3 P.M. made all sail, hove up about 6 P.M. with the assistance of the boat went to me, in company with the Kido & Endeavor, latter part strong, under double reefed topsails.

Friday April 13

at 7.30 A.M. came to anchor of Kawaichae, three ship at anchor, strong, fore & latter part.

Saturday April 14

Commenced strong, two ship dragged off, one ship aimed to do, at 4 P.M. sent down the royal yards, employed latter part painting ship and mending the main boom.

Sunday April 15th

Commenced very strong, a few hours, a number of vessels aimed here to do, Mercury Lydia Florida, Peimian aimed to do from Honolulu & believe the Lydia came near the reef, boats went from most all the ships and got in underway.

Monday April 16

moderate all day, nothing worthy of notice.

Tuesday April 17th 1866

fine weather all day, got our potatoes to dry, one land breeze to go to see with to do.

Wednesday April 18

strong sea breeze all day, ship waiting for a loading would go to sea with.

Thursday April 19

at 8 A.M. hove up & went to sea, strong, at 12 night shortened sail.

Friday April 20

rained Waikoo at 1 P.M. at 6 sent a boat ashore, latter part employed baking our oat oil from butter on deck.

Saturday April 21st

at 6 A.M. came to anchor outside of the reef at Honolulu, employed the latter part securing the oil ashore, got the boat ashore.
