Remarks on board Ship Gov Troop. Capt. T. H. ...
Tuesday June 5th/66

Commenced with a calm. Two sails in sight
rather thick & hazy. middle & latter part moderate

Latitude 60° 30' N Long 173° 14'

Wednesday June 6th/66

Spent twenty four hours commenced with a moderate
from about 11 AM all sail set as heading to the N. by E. the
fog all day, blowing the fog horn as we go along the
fog, but hear no response Latitude 61° 10' N Long 173° 14'

Thursday June 7th/66

commenced with a thick fog. wind from the N. by E. at 11 AM
to the N. by E. all sail set at 4:30 fog lifted. saw one
from aloft on the water quater. at 7 PM called in the
Mile. later part light - Lat 60° 50' N Longitude 179° 14'

Friday June 8th/66

commenced light & continued in all through the day
about 9. went on board of the Mile. nothing worthy
notice through the fog. Lat 61° 15' N Longitude 178° 14'

Saturday June 9th/66

commenced fine wind from the N. at 4 PM commenced
haul around to the N. at 10 AM wind N. by E. standing
in shore. about 4 AM raised the ice. first for the
season. Two sails in sight. at 10 AM went down the
foresail & lost another old one. went into the ice the
being very light. at 11 thick fog. at 2 PM went ship
& stood out of the ice & had a back wind from the S.
latter part thick fog.

Sunday June 10th/66

Commenced with a moderate breeze from the S. by E.
at 8 AM let up stood in to the ice. saw a number
of ships at 4 PM gained with the Lydia & Mr. Wallston
at 7 PM general gain. among the number the
Bark "Hellen" Mar Capt. Herenden. per
Mr. Herenden I received a letter from Colia
1825 for had ought to have been 26 as the other
one was 25. I did have the privilege of seeing my
old Shipmate. latter part thick

Monday June 11th And no wind

Commenced moderate. middle part
running through the ice. went in clear water
when a few miles of ships (Cape Navirene
Navirene) put the spear anchor on the
& got up the small chain. gaming with the
Florida

Tuesday June 12th/66

Commenced with a moderate breeze from the S. by E. at
steering N. by E. at 4 AM saw the Ship, Ocean.
have their boats down kept up. Raised a bar-
head. toward their boat. "Starboard" boat struck the
Capt. board the water boat & killed the whale. struck him
the ship rising the whale had after lowering. had no
trouble with him at all. got close to. commenced to
cut at 1:30 PM. finished about 3:30 During the after-
noon four Captains came on board Cape Thaddeus. D. B. B.
Hawes & Miller all clean. latter part light - air Sat -
Long

Wednesday June 13th/66

Commenced light & continued in all through the day
twenty four hours. at 10 PM gained with the Mr. Wall-
ton & Norman. Capt. Childs. started the work at
4 AM & commenced to boil. Lat - N Long

Thursday June 14th/66

commenced light. middle & latter part much like the
fore part. employed boiling. at 3 PM gained with
the Ship. Joseph Perry. at 4 a general gain. all the
Capt. coming on board the Gov Troop. among the
whole number. there was but one which had a whole
Say Head three whales heard of the Capt. Perry. 1
and 7 whales Saagoo 3 Mipera. 1 Holola 1 Illinois 1

Friday June 15th/66

Commenced light from the N. by E. running to the
southeast. about 8 or 10 miles of shore. off Cape Thaddeus
about 1 PM. Norman & Say Head. inshore of us at
7 PM the Norman had three boats down. latter part
foggy

Saturday June 16th/66

Commenced light and foggy. at 9 AM Capt. Childs
of the Say Head came on board & left - until about
2 or 3 PM. & then went on board to see some black-
smithing gave us. finished boiling this morning
employed through the day steering down the ice
at 4 PM strong breeze & thick under double reefed

Sunday June 17th/66

commenced strong under reefed. at 11 AM
light - made all sail. steering to the S. by E. at 11 PM
from the N. by E. steering about N. by E. at 12 PM sig-
nalled of J. & W. B. Wing. both called in the
Awashonk. at 7 PM saw a ship standing to the
S. by E. called in the Thomas Dickerson. latter
part fresh
