Tuesday January 3rd / 67

Commenced with fresh breeze from the S. & E.
heading to the W. all sail set, steering by
wind. A muffle getting way to head &
bending I old jib for a maintopmast
Staysail, after we got in bent it did not
well, so long on the lee, & at 3.30 I Long

Wednesday January 9th / 67

*Commenced fish. from the S & Co. heading
to the S & S & W. Employed getting a
mainboom as staysail, later part during*

Thursday January 10th 1867

Commenced moderate from above E. N. E. at 11
at. steering by the wind heading to the S. & E.
Employed Ketchikan papers. Lat 37.25 S Long 154.16

Friday January 11th / 67

Commoned - material from the ship & Ed all sail
at, shoring by the wind, heading about S E, game
with the ship, Corvus II. outland, engulfed - nothing
spengarn. & in ship's dust, I at S, Lash

Saturday Friday 4 Jan 12

Entered in ship's log. Hoisted the jib & main-
sails (but the best ever) storing 600 lbs. (I think)
Latitude 42° 00' N. Long 147° 30'

employed in ship. ~~made a mission royal & gave~~

Tuesday January 15th 1867

Commenced stowing from the Mahomed, stowing
at 4.4.16 took in some of the light sails, &
all sail up, we held & sailed the ship
middle of latter part - much like the fore part

Commenced with a smashing breeze from the NE
all sail set, steering E. middle & latter part much
like the Sea Fort Lat 43. 8. Long 133. 41 West -

strong from the Westward all sail set steering East

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Friday January 18th /67

Commenced with a strong breeze from N. E. W. all
sail set shiring E. employed drawing gars. caught
a panpos the first one since we left the island.
Latitude 48.00 S. Longitude 124.08

Saturday June 19th 1867

Commenced with a gale of wind from the N. by W.
blowing E, carried away the cross jack yard, running
under a double reefed main close reefed fore & foresail
latter part wind west. all sail set Sat. & Sun.

Sunday January 20th / 62

Commenced with a clearing sweep from the Methodist at
 sent set, storing E. employed the fore part fitting & ending
 up a crossface yard, middle & latter part much like the
 fore part Latitude 47.16, South. Longitude 115.43 N 40

Monday January 21st / 67.

fish from about N.W. corner of pool breaking out water out of the main hatch (between decks) & making hole, latter part. fish got from about N.W. during 6 PM main cyclone sail on. Lat 47° 54' S. Longitude 110° 46' W.

Tuesday January 22nd / 67

fresh gal. from NW. main legal and set, storing 6 ft
middle part, wind that, to all sail set - latter part wind
short SW. embers repairing - main legal and set

Wednesday January 23rd 1867
Strong the whole twenty four hours. Employed in ships duty
taller part rain Lat 4 Longitude 110

Thursday January 24th 1867

Scum - with a strong breeze from the N. main (galat)
bar, strong E. gale, part wind W. N.

Friday January 25th / 67

commenced fresh from the storm. all sail set steering
about E. Sailed fast quite moderate and took during the
forenoon Lat. 51.20 S. Long 72.20 W.

Saturday January 26th / 67

Commenced forth from the Hotel all sail not starting
E. or took in the main reef & and after short head
middle & later saw the same sail & long the

Sunday Jan 27th/67

fresh breeze from the N. E. all sail set steering E. latter
fair light & raining from the N. E. Lat 32.50 S Long 94.7

Monday, January 28th 1868

Commenced moderate from the N. at 10:15 - at 2³⁰
 hoisted 4 sharp 3 light sails in 4 double reefs topsails & foremast
 at 9 single reefed maintop sail wired about 5.11 maintop
 & whole fore topsails & mainboom set in latter part fresh
 with rain. Lat
