

Cape Horn Jan 30th / 67

Tuesday January 29th / 67

Commenced fresh from the N.W. steering E. 1/2 S during the fore part - middle & latter part E. 1/2 N. middle & latter part, rain, running before the wind with the mainsail & Mizzen topsail furled fore topsail double reefed & at 36.00 of Long 76.54 W

Wednesday January 31st / 67

Commenced strong from the N.W. steering E. 1/2 N. at 4.00 turned the ship out of the fore topsail & at the studding sail at 4.40 made the land (Dingo) latter part fresh steering E. 1/2 S. Latitude 56.32 S Longitude 69.44 W

Thursday January 31st / 67

Commenced fresh from the N.W. steering about N.E. at 1.00 backed sharp up - moderate at 2.00 look in all the light sails, wind from the Westward, at 4 strong running latter part running with Reintegalan sail Lat 55.40 S Long 69.00 W

Friday February 1st / 67

Commenced fresh from the Westward, at 2.00 made all sail, steering N.W. & middle part, latter part shortens sail & hoist to strong, & at last 3.00 The third line is cover

Saturday February 2nd

Strong & the wind, short sail at 2.30, at 4.00 set & main, at 12.00, raised land & at 1.00 an island, passed along close to them at 1.00 call all hands & double reefed the topsails blowing very strong, but held, intended to have slept but the beer was too strong, so we were along under easy sail Lat 54.30 S Long 57.22 W

Sunday February 3rd / 67

Commenced strong from the N.W. steering the N.W. & under easy sail, at 5.30 spoke the Ship, Charles W. Morgan, having seen sperm whales the night previous, late to the wind all night, latter part moderate Lat 54.00 S Long 57.00 W

Monday February 4th

Commenced fresh, at 1.00 made sail, latter part strong, gained with the Charles W. Morgan Captain Landers & wife & child came on board, wind N.W. heading to the Westward

Tuesday February 5th

Strong from the N.W. & thick under short sail bent the fore spencer, hoisted out two logpoies, latter part quite moderate, Bent the fore spencer

Wednesday February 6th / 67

Commenced moderate but thick, under easy sail at 7.00 clear, made sail, about 11 strong double reefed the topsail, at 3.00 whole topsails & main, legation boat at 4 raised sperm whale lower three boats, starboard boat went on but did not get fast, latter part moderate & thick fog, Lat 47.40 S Long 58.10 W

Thursday February 7th / 67

Commenced moderate from the N.W. & thick fog, at 10.00 let up, saw the Ship, Charles W. Morgan at a distance

Friday February 8th / 67

Commenced strong, I guess (I most fages)

Saturday Feb 9th / 67

Not hold this morning, working to the S.W.

Sunday February 10th / 67

Pleasant all day, fore part working to the N.W. & latter part working to the S.W.

Monday February 11th / 67

Commenced pleasant & continued so all the day, about 1.30 P.M. raised sperm whale going quick on the wind, chased until dark & that is all the good it did, whale going to the S.W.

Tuesday February 12th / 67

Commenced with thick fog, not hold this morning, middle & latter part fine weather Lat 48.06 S Long 58.00 W

Wednesday February 13th

Commenced fine & continued so all the day, at 10.00 signalled nine English Frigate saw several finbacks to day Lat 45.25 S Long 57.42 W

Thursday February 14th

fine weather, fore & middle part, latter part fresh, at 1.00 spoke the Bark Sarah, A. Staples of Belfast, the ship from Beannagar bound to Castles, at 6.00 gained with the Ship, Cor - Howland from Port Stamb, having been there to coopers oil latter part fresh from the N.W. heading to the S.W.

Friday February 15th

Commenced strong from the N.W. heading to the N.W. under short sail, at 2.00 gained with the Cor Howland latter part thick & strong

Saw sperm whale

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
