

Ship Charles of Gallapagos Islands May 1838.

167. Wednesday May 15th 1838. Moderate Trades & 4 AM. 2 Boats went ashore at South head got 10 large tortoise and one turtle. Lat 1-15 S. Long 91-10

168. Thursday 16th Moderate Trades and rising weather the land in sight. Lat 1-20 S. Long 91 West

169. Friday 18th Moderate Trades and clear, saw the ship Midas. Had two Harbours Boats. Lat 1-10 S. Long 91 West

170. Saturday 19th Light Trades from S.E. South head of Albermarle in sight. Lat 1-30 S. Long 91-40 West

171. Sunday 20th Light Breezes and pleasant weather, Albermarle and Marlborough in sight. Saw 2 ships to leeward. Lat 5-50 Miles. Long

172. Monday 21st Light Breeze from the S.E. spoke the ships - Washington of Kentucky, 22 Months old. Abigail of N.Y. 30 Mo. 2400 Bbls. and Mobile. At 2 PM. 50 Miles to the S.W. by the Abigail.

173. Tuesday 22nd Light Breeze and pleasant. 3 Ships in sight, strong current setting S.E. Lat 3-40 Miles S. Long 92 West

174. Wednesday 23rd Light Trades nothing in sight. Lat 3-35 Miles S. Long 92

175. Thursday 24th Light Trades and pleasant, nothing in sight, steering S.W. Lat 1-18 S. Long 92-20 West.

176. Friday 25th Pleasant Trades from S.E. steering to S.W. Nothing in sight. Lat 2- Long 94 West.

177. Saturday 26th Pleasant Trades from S.E. heading to the S.W. Lat 2-50 S. Long 96 West.

Ship Charles off Shore May & June 1838.

178. Sunday May 27th 1838. Fresh Trades and pleasant weather, steering to the S.W. and Portend. Lat 3-50 S. Long 98-10 West.

179. Monday 28th Fresh Trades from the S.E. at 10 AM saw a school of sperm Whales. at 1 PM. towed the boats. the North boat struck and killed one. Lat 4-30 S. Long 100-20 West.

180. Tuesday 29th Fresh Trades all hands employ'd. sailing out. to Labrador. Lat 4-40 S. West 101.

181. Wednesday 30th Strong Trades at 7 AM. finished sailing. plenty of fish tracks in sight. Lat 5-10 S. Long 102 West.

182. Thursday 31st Strong Trades at 6 AM. steering to the South nothing in sight, but fish tracks. Lat 5-30 S. Long 102 West.

183. Friday June 1st 1838 Strong Trades. saw a ship on our beam steering to the S.E. they saw their signal and knew her. Lat 6-40 S. Long 102-20

184. Saturday 2nd Strong Trades and squally, nothing in sight. Lat 8-20 Long

185. Sunday 3rd Strong Trades with rain squalls, steering to the S.W. the ship in sight. Lat 6-10 S. Long 102-50 West.

186. Monday 4th Strong Trades and squally. at noon saw a ship steering to the South, supposed her to be the shadow of Fairhaven. Lat 8-10 Long 102

187. Tuesday 5th Strong Trades at 7 AM. saw a large sperm whale on our weather beam. he turned & fired saw no more of him. no ship in sight. Lat 4-40 S. Long 102-30

188. Wednesday 6th Strong Trades at daylight saw 2 ships on our weather beam. at 8 AM. spoke the U.S. Washington of Newham. 28 Months old. the State of N.Y. with got killed by a large whale 3 harks ago. Lat 5- S. Long 102-40 West.
