199. Thursday June 7th 1838. Moderate Trades and pleasant. at daylight, saw 3 Ships steering to the South. Lat 4-30. Long 102-40.

200 Friday 8th. Light Trades and pleasant weather. 3 Ships in sight. Lat 5-20. Long 102-40.

201 Saturday 9th. Light Trades, fine weather. at daylight one ship made the North Head. Lat 4-40. Long 103-00.

202 Sunday 10th. Light Trades and pleasant, spoke the Ship Stanton of Fairhaven. 22 Months 400 Bbls. Lat 4-50. Long 102-30.

203 Monday 11th. Fresh Trades. one ship in sight steering to the N.E. Lat 5-00. Long 102-00.

204 Tuesday 12th. Fresh Trades and pleasant weather. Nothing in sight. Lat 4-10. Long 102-20.

205 Wednesday 13th. Fresh Trades. spoke the Ship Alwash. - of Falkmouth. 22 Months 400 Bbls. Lat 4-10. Long 102-15.

206 Thursday 14th. Fresh Trades and pleasant. steering to North. Nothing in sight. Lat 3-11. Long 102-10.

207 Friday 15th. Moderate and pleasant. Lat 0-11. Long 102-00.

208 Saturday 16th. Moderate Trades. caught a Porpoise. nothing of consequence in sight. Lat 5-40. Long 102-50.

209 Sunday 17th. Fresh Trades. hauled to the Eastward for the D. Lat 3-55. Long 103-00.

210 Monday 18th. Fresh Trades with rain squalls. steering to the Eastward. Lat 3-51. Long 101-30.

Ship Charles. Bound to St. Michaels. June 1838

211 Tuesday 19th 1838. Fresh Trades at daylight, saw a brig on the sea. steering to the N.E. Lat 3-40. Long 98-00.

212 Wednesday 20th. Fresh Trades and squally with rain. steering to the Eastward. Lat 4-30. Long 97-20.

213 Thursday 21st. Strong Trades and squally with rain. making for South. steering to the East. Lat 4-55. Long 96-00.

214 Friday 22nd. Strong Southerly Trades. with frequent rain squalls. steering to the East. Lat 4-26. Long 93-00.

215 Saturday 23rd. Strong Trades and squally. with rain. Nothing in sight. Lat 0-50. Long 91-45.

216 Sunday 24th. Strong Southerly Trades with rain. Lat 13-15. Long 89-40.

217 Monday 25th. Fresh Trades and cloudy. steering to Eastward and Southward. Lat 2-28. Long 86-00.

218 Tuesday 26th. Strong S. Trades with frequent rain squalls. Lat 1-55. Long 83-00.

219 Wednesday 27th. Strong Trades and squally with rain. Lat 1-10. Long 80-30.

220 Thursday 28th. Strong Trades with frequent rain squalls at 5 A.M. made the land. at 11 A.M. came to anchor in 7 fathoms. saw of Falkmouth 22 Months 400 Bbls. the only ship in Harbour. at 3 P.M. towed the cargo up the river for North. Lat 1-00. Long 79-50.

221 Friday 29th. Fine weather all hands employed in ships. at the Boat crew taking boards. one filling water and one with the Capt. a loading so end.
