the hopes of getting to them. But they started to underwood

the Eastward. Lat. 7° 17' S. Long. 60° 12' West.

a shoal of Eilers, a killing two Humpbacks. & 10 A.M.

at 10 p. M. tack to the S. E. W.

saw a plenty of fin backs. & 9 A.M. tack to the S.S.W.
