

Ship Charles Coast of Peru Nov<sup>r</sup> 1838.

351. Wednesday Nov 14<sup>th</sup> Moderate and clear at daylight, saw the land bearing from N. to ESE. dist 40 Miles. Tacked ship to S.W. by the wind Noon Lat<sup>d</sup> 13-55 S. Long<sup>d</sup> 78-00 West  
saw black fish and finbacks. 5 P. tacked to the East.
352. Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> Fresh trades and clear at daylight, the land in sight on our lee bow dist 20 Miles. Tacked ship to the S.W. by S. Noon Lat<sup>d</sup> 14-58 S. Long<sup>d</sup> 76-40 West  
tacked to the East. Sunset tacked to the S.W. by the wind.
353. Friday 16<sup>th</sup> Fresh trades and clear, steering to the S.W. saw black fish Noon Lat<sup>d</sup> 15-03 S. Long<sup>d</sup> 78-09 West.  
6 P. tacked to the East. by the wind.
354. Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> Moderate and clear 7 A.M. Reft the ship of N.W. 11 haul<sup>d</sup> to the N.W. saw plenty of black fish killed one from the ship did not save him also finbacks Noon Lat<sup>d</sup> 14-30 S. Long<sup>d</sup> 77-42 W. at sunset.  
trailed round headed to the S.W. by the wind.
355. Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> Pleasant and fine weather. Midnight tacked to the E.N.E. at daylight. Reft the ship of West. saw humpbacks, black fish and finbacks Noon Lat<sup>d</sup> 13-43 S. Long<sup>d</sup> 78-34. Sunset trailed round to the East.
356. Monday 19<sup>th</sup> Light trades and pleasant at daylight steering off S.W. Noon Lat<sup>d</sup> 13-21 S. Long<sup>d</sup> 78-00 West. saw nothing this day. at sunset haul round headed to the E.N.E. with the main top sail to the West.
357. Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> Moderate and pleasant weather at daylight. Reft off North. Noon Lat<sup>d</sup> 12-19 S. Long<sup>d</sup> 78-55 W. 4 P.M. haul<sup>d</sup> up N.W. by N. Nothing in sight.

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- Wednesday Nov 21<sup>st</sup> Light trades and pleasant at daylight, saw the land dist 25 Miles. at noon one boat left the ship for the shore. Could not obtain a landing 5 P.M. the boat returned to the ship, steering to the N.W. the land dist 7 Miles Lat<sup>d</sup> 10-43 Long<sup>d</sup> 77-50
- Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> Light trades and fine weather at midnight haul<sup>d</sup> the head yards abaft. at daylight Reft off N.W. 7 A.M. haul<sup>d</sup> in for the Port of Sawmuy with the intent of watering and procuring refreshments. could not obtain any water. The boat went on shore. went to town which is 3 Miles back. procured 3 lbs. Potatoes which is good. 4 P.M. the boat returned to the ship Noon Lat<sup>d</sup> 10-08 S. Long<sup>d</sup> 78-05. saw 2 Ships and one brig steering to the N.W. R.
- Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> Light trades. steering along shore to the S.W. at daylight saw 3 Ships one brig and a schooner 7 A.M. spoke a Chilean ship. Noon haul<sup>d</sup> up N.W. for the Port of Santa 4 P.M. the boat went on shore to ascertain if could get water. 8 P.M. the boat returned. Noon Lat<sup>d</sup> 9-14 S Long<sup>d</sup> 78-35 West.
- Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> Standing off and on at the Port of Santa. Made look a raft of castles on shore for water. got the raft along side 11 P.M. 1 A.M. finish<sup>d</sup> hoisting it on board Lat<sup>d</sup> 9-08.
- Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> Light trades and pleasant 9 A.M. the boat went on shore for Potatoes 5 lbs. and 1 lb of mixed 7 P.M. the boat returned. steering to the S.W. by the wind.
- Monday 26<sup>th</sup> Fresh trades. Howed the water steering to the S.W. by the wind. Lat<sup>d</sup> 9-10 S. Long<sup>d</sup> 79- West nothing in sight.
- Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> Moderate trades steering to the S.W. by the wind (not any thing in sight. Lat<sup>d</sup> 9-56 S. Long<sup>d</sup> 80-57 W.
