

Ship. Charles. Gallapagos Islands Jan 1839.

425. Monday. January 28th Light trades and pleasant headed to the S.W. saw Black fish & 10. M. fine fish. Boiling saw a ship on the sea beam sunset headed to the E. N. Charles Island off the sea bow bearing North with 10 miles Lat 1° 35' S.

426 Tuesday 29th Light trades and pleasant headed to the South. Saw a ship to leeward & 10 A.M. tacked to the S.E. sunset tacked to the S.W. Charles Island bearing N. with 5 miles noon Lat 1° 34' S.

427 Wednesday 30th Moderate trades & with tacked to the S.E. 10 A.M. tacked to the S.W. Charles Island bearing E. N. with 25 miles also the South Sea of Albemarle to leeward noon Lat 1° 43' S.

428 Thursday 31st Light trades and pleasant headed to the S.E. 1 P.M. tacked to the S.E. Charles Island off the sea bow saw a ship to leeward for it saw a ship back. Noon Lat 1° 50' S. Long 140° 42' W.

429 Friday February 1st 1839. Light air and pleasant & 1 A.M. hauled the head yards aback headed off shore. at day light the Capt. went on shore at Florina Charles Island to obtain refreshments. 11 A.M. the mate went on shore and caught 3 turtles at sundown the boat returned with 13 lb. lbs. potatoes and 50 pounds of ship's a Portuguese Antonio by name. noon Lat 1° 24' S. the middle of the island bearing E. by N. distant 2 miles & 1 P.M. headed off shore.

430 Saturday 2nd Light air and pleasant at daylight the boat went on shore. discharged one man. Sailed 10 A.M. The ship's freight by Rickelson of New Bedford 6 months 1200 lbs. Spun 50 thals. to make a new dress officer pay. her boat being on shore. whenever land was seen for us. 4 P.M. returned to the ship with 20 lbs. potatoes returned to the shore & 11 P.M. the boat returned with 9 lbs. potatoes. in all 42 lb. lbs. headed off shore to the S.W.

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431 Sunday Feb 3rd 1839. Light trades and pleasant headed to the E. N. Charles Island ahead & 11 A.M. tacked to the S.W. & 3 P.M. tacked to the E. N. Charles Island at sundown 1 P.M. of the sea bow distant 10 miles noon Lat 1° 34' S.

432 Monday 4th Pleasant trades and fine weather at daylight kept off North. saw a ship headed to the E. N. & 4 P.M. hauled round to the Eastward the South head of Albemarle off the sea beam with 10 miles Lat 1° 17' Long 90° 57' W.

433 Tuesday 5th Light trades and pleasant. Midnight headed to the S.W. at daylight saw a ship to windward & 8 A.M. headed to the Eastward sunset Charles Island bore N. E. by E. with 20 miles saw a ship to leeward noon Lat 1° 28' S. Long 90° 48' W.

434 Wednesday 6th Light air and pleasant headed to the Eastward daylight saw 2 ships one of them the Friends headed to the S.W. sunset Charles Island bearing N. E. with 15 miles noon Lat 1° 37' S. Long 90° 42' W.

435 Thursday 7th Light air and pleasant headed to the S.W. & 6 A.M. kept off N. N. W. & 3 P.M. spoke the ship the Allen - of New Bedford 6 months 150 lbs. sunset Charles Island bearing East with 35 miles noon Lat 1° 43' S.

436 Friday 8th Light trades and pleasant headed off to the North & 1 P.M. the ship spoke in sight & 2 P.M. saw a school of whales of the weather bow & lowers the boats succeeded in taking one at sundown took him alongside Capt. Allen came on board. discharged George Allen. Capt. Allen son on account of sickness. noon Lat 1° 34' South head bearing S. E. by E. with 10 miles -
