452. Sunday Feb 24th 1839. Calm, with light air headed to the East.
Saw 9 amphipods and porpoises at 10 AM towed the boat to the
Curren, found a little on none what their was, was sailing to the N.W.
Moon Lat^o 2.40 S. Long 84.40 W. 91. 15. Fresh. Sand

453. Monday 25th Most part of this day calm, afternoon light
breezes from S.E. to N.W. Saw one finback. Moon
Lat^o 2.51. Long 84.40 W. 90. 58. Fresh. Sand

454. Tuesday 26th First part and middle fresh breeze from
N.W. headed to the East with heavy rains after part
light air from the West. Moon Lat^o 2.50 Long 84.40 W. 90. 58. Fresh. Sand

455. Wednesday 27th All the day 24 hours calm, nothing
in sight. Moon Lat^o 2.40 Long 84.40 W. 90. 45. Fresh. Sand

456. Thursday 28th First part. Calm with rain. Middle part
light air from the Westward later part fresh S.E. trades
headed by the wind to the Eastward saw a ship bearing N by W
from us called the Fisher. Moon Lat^o 2.41 S. Long 84.40 W. 91. 58. Fresh.

457. Friday March 1st 1839. First and middle part Moderate breeze
and pleasant. Later part light trades with passing rain squalls
at daylight, saw the ship Fisher again also Black fish
Moon Lat^o 2.26 Long 84.40 W. 89. 46. Fresh.

458. Saturday 2nd Light trades and pleasant daylight. Heard a
sight bearing N by W distant 40 miles. Black fish in sight
day. Bound to the Eastward Moon Lat^o 1.58 S. Long 84.40 W. 89. 40. Fresh.

459. Sunday 3rd Light winds from the N.W. headed to the East
South East. Moon Lat^o 2.27 S. Long 84.40 W. 89. 14. Fresh
Sunset fresh breeze and cloudy to clear the land day. Sand

460. Monday March 4th 1839. Strong breeze from N.E. heading E by S.
saw 3 finbacks later part light air at E.W. Moon Lat^o 3.27 S.
Long 84.40 W. 88. 34. Fresh. Sand

461. Tuesday 5th Strong breeze with rain squalls. saw black fish
later part light air from the East headed to the N.E.
Moon Lat^o 3.26 S. Long 84.40 W. 87. 54. Fresh.

462. Wednesday 6th Light trades and pleasant, headed to the N.E.
at noon headed to the S.E. saw black fish. Covered two boats
struck both 2 boats got nothing. Moon Lat^o 4.20 S. Long 84.40 W. Fresh.

463. Thursday 7th Moderate trades and pleasant headed to the N.E.
saw black fish toward one boat got nothing
Moon Lat^o 3.52 S. Long by Lunar Obs 84.40 W. 85. 38. 45. 86. 1. 15. W.

464. Friday 8th Moderate and pleasant, saw finbacks. Moon Wind
hauler round to the North with rain. Headed to the Eastward
Lat^o 3.44 S. Long by Lunar Obs 84.40 W. 85. 3. 86. 15. 30. Fresh.

465. Saturday 9th Light breeze from the East and pleasant, saw one
finback. also a schooner headed to the South. Moon Lat^o 3.19 S.
Long 84.40 W. 84. 57. Fresh.

466. Sunday 10th Light air and pleasant, saw porpoises headed to the
Eastward Moon Lat^o 2.45 S. Long Lunar 84.32. Obs 84.40. Fresh.

467. Monday 11th Light air and pleasant, headed to the S.E.
at 2 P.M. saw a school of Whales covered the boats took
the to the Starboard boat, the Starboard boat struck another
the boats moved. Sunset got the whale alongside of the
Moon Lat^o 2.43 S. Long by Lunar 84.02. 30. Obs 84.1. 30. Fresh.
