

Ship Charles Coast of Peru March 1839.

483. Wednesday March 27th 1839. Light trades and pleasant employed repairing the foremast and covering the bilge decks the ship thebe in sight. Noon Lat 2-25 S. Long 84-08 West.

484. Thursday 28th Light airs and Calms. day light commenced showing the bill down headed to the North and East, the thebe in sight. At the Lee beam. Sunset finished. Stowed down 7 lbs. of oil. Noon Lat 2-11 S. Long 84-11 W. dark headed to the S.W. - at 20 lbs between deck.

485. Friday 29th Light trades and pleasant, headed to the S.W. at 2 p.m. wore shift to the N.E. and spoke the ship thebe of Xant. Noon Lat 2-32 S. Long 84-24 West.

486. Saturday 30th Light airs and pleasant weather headed to the N.E. saw finbacks and caught the ship thebe in sight. Noon Lat 2-40 S. Long 84-26 West.

487. Sunday 31st Light trades and pleasant weather headed to the N.E. the ship thebe in sight, saw a large bone shark. Noon Lat 2-14 S. Long 84-40 West.

488. Monday April 1st Light trades and pleasant headed to the Eastward. They then shab ship 2 in sight came off and refused to do any more whaling duty as their time was up they having shipped for 8 months at 2 p.m. the ship thebe of the sea beam. Made signal for whals. we held off for her covered 2 boats without success. the thebe's boats having struck which she then going, saw her take 3 whals. along side and stowed boats. Noon Lat 2-02 S. Long 84-42 West.

489. Tuesday 2nd Light trades and pleasant headed to the Eastward. for port of Macambes for wood and water employed setting up. Casks for water. nothing in sight. Lat 1-52 S. Long 84-46. Chas 83-04. 30

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490. Wednesday April 3rd 1839. Light airs and Calms employed setting up casks. 10 a.m. set the foremast studding sail. steering to the N.E. nothing in sight. Noon Lat 1-33 S. Long 84-47 W. Chas 83-20 West.

491. Thursday 4th Light breeze from S. to N.E. steering to the N.E. at daylight saw the land bearing N.E. by E. dist 50 miles also saw one finback. Noon Lat 0-38 N. Long 84-46 Chas 81-35 West.

492. Friday 5th Light breeze and pleasant weather steering N.E. by E. the land in sight. Noon Lat 0-12 N. Long 84-46 Chas 80-55 West.

493. Saturday 6th Pleasant breeze from the South steering to the N.E. at daylight. Point Galera bore N.E. by E. distant 6 miles at 11 A.M. Came to anchor of the River Macambes in the Lat 0-50 N. Long 79-40. One boat went on shore for wood.

494. Sunday 7th All hands on shore except the Capt and two hands.

495. Monday 8th All hands employed wooding and watering. Stowed down 15 lbs oil.

496. Tuesday 9th Hands employed wooding and getting the raft of water along side.

497. Wednesday 10th Employed cutting wood and stowing water.

498. Thursday 11th Employed cutting wood and stowing water.

499. Friday 12th Employed cutting wood and other jobs.

500. Saturday 13th Employed cutting wood got a raft of casks up the River for water.

501. Sunday 14th All hands on shore except the Capt and two hands.
