120 Friday 3rd Fresh trades and fair weather. (at daylight) all hands got breakfast and commenced cutting the whale. finished cutting (at noon) saw the land. The Capt. ordered for blackfish without success. To end all well. Lat 0° 40' N. 42° 30' W. Lon per. 82° 50' W.

121 Saturday 4th Fresh trades and fair weather. (at midnight) finished haling. To day with the Aurora in sight off our larboard. Lat 0° 40' N. 41° 30' W. Lon per. 82° 50' W. 03° 30' N. 82° 07' W.

122 Sunday 5th Moderate breezes and fair weather. (at daylight) saw the land. (at noon) saw Point Paita ahead. (at 3 PM) came to anchor in the Harbour of Paita in 7 fathoms water muddy bottom. To end all well.

123 Monday 6th Pleasant weather. one watch on liberty ashore. The other cleaning ship. (at sunset) liberty men came on board. To end all well. To end all well.

124 Tuesday 7th Pleasant weather. Starboard watch on liberty. Starboard watch employed painting ship. Ship Henry Chase of Ouantucket touched here and landed capt. Chase sick. (at sunset) all the liberty men came on board except a boatman by the name of Henry W. Taylor. To end all well.

125 Wednesday 8th Fine pleasant breezes and fair weather. Starboard watch on liberty. The other painting ship. Ship Henry Chase of Ouantucket touched here and landed capt. Chase sick. (at sunset) all the liberty men came on board except a boatman by the name of Henry W. Taylor. To end all well.

127 Friday 10th pleasant breezes and fair weather. Starboard watch on liberty. The other painting ship. Ship Henry Chase of Ouantucket touched here and landed capt. Chase sick. (at sunset) all the liberty men came on board except a boatman by the name of Henry W. Taylor. To end all well.

128 Saturday 11th pleasant trades. Starboard watch on liberty. The other getting off potatoes and getting ready for sea. (at 5 PM) liberty came on board also two Spaniards a mariner and one coloured man as boatsteerer. (at 6 PM) our anchor and stood to sea. To end all well.

129 Sunday 12th Pleasant breezes and fair weather daylight Paita. Starboard watch also a ship to tomorrow supposed to be the Aurora. plenty of blackfish. Noon Lat 0° 51' S. Long 82° 30' W.

130 Monday 13th Pleasant breezes headed to the S.W. saw plenty of blackfish. Lat 4° 52' S. Long per. 82° 49' W.

131 Tuesday 14th Pleasant trades. Headed to the S.E. employed painting the inside of the Starboard boat. bent a new Mizen topsail. Noon Lat 4° 34' S. Long per. 82° 48' W.

132 Wednesday 15th Light breezes and pleasant weather daylight. unbent the main topsail. repaired it. (at 4 PM) bent it. Noon Lat 4° 44' S. Long per. 82° 31' W.

133 Thursday 16th Fresh trades employed mending the mainsail and painting the Starboard boat. Noon Lat 4° 08' S. Long 82° 40' W.

134 Friday 17th Moderate breezes and hazy weather headed to the South. employed mending the mainsail. (at 5 PM) bent it. Noon Lat 3° 06' S. Long per. 83° 06' W. Lunar 83° 11' W.

135 Saturday 18th Pleasant breezes and fine weather headed to the West. saw blackfish. Noon Lat 2° 58' S. Long per. 83° 54' W.
