#99. Monday Oct 28th Light trades and pleasant headed to the S.W. saw finbacks and Blackfish also a ship to leeward - Noon Lat 4-11. S. Long 82-22. West

#100. Tuesday 29th Light trades and pleasant headed to the S.W. plenty of finbacks and Blackfish in sight employed mending the Mast, Boats and Blacking the Chain Cable. Noon Lat 5-30 S. Long 84-31 West

#101. Wednesday 30th Light trades and pleasant headed to the S.W. plenty of Blackfish in sight employed Blacking the Chain Cable 6 P.M. spoke the Ship American of Nantucket 15th Month 1839. Lat 6-2 S. Long 84-43. West.

#102. Thursday 31st Light trades and pleasant headed to the S.W. noon headed to the N.E. started hauling the Main topsail to the mast saw Blackfish. Noon Lat 6-30 S. Long 83-48. West.

#103. Friday Nov 1st Moderate and pleasant headed to the N.E. saw finbacks. Noon Lat 5-47 S. Long 86-11. Ch 85-23. 15.

#104. Saturday 2nd Moderate and pleasant headed to the S.W. saw finbacks and Blackfish Lat 5-26 S. Long 86- West.

#105. Sunday 3rd Light trades and pleasant headed to the S.W. by the wind saw Blackfish Noon Lat 5-47 S. Long 86-45.

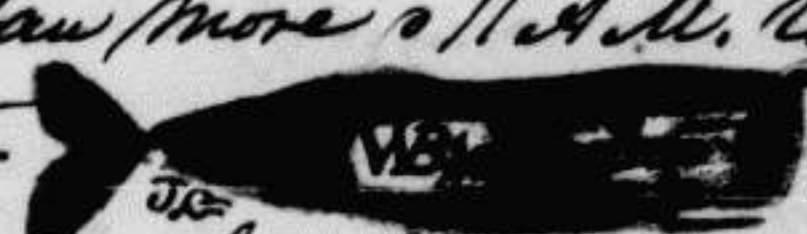
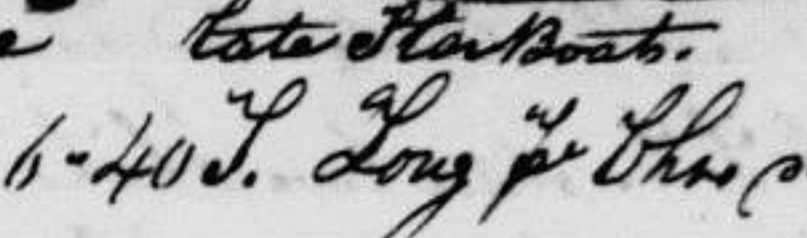
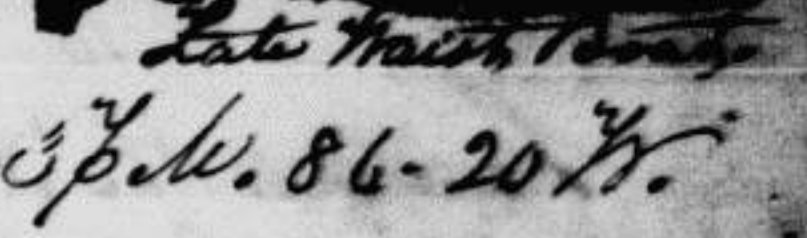
#106. Monday 4th Pleasant trades and fine weather headed to the S.W. broke up the old boats. Noon Lat 6-40 S. Long 87-33. West.

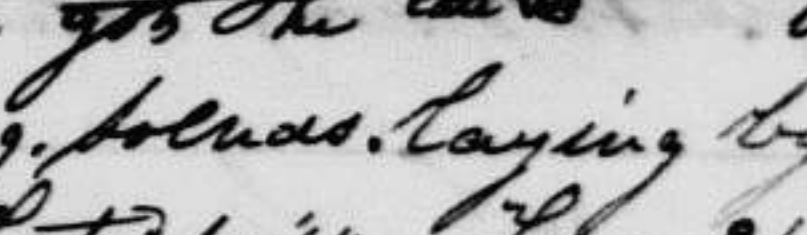
#107. Tuesday 5th Fresh trades with passing squalls - headed to the S.W. noon headed to the S.W. employed in mending ship duty saw Lat 7-00 S. Long 87-44.

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#108. Wednesday Nov 6th Light trades and pleasant headed to the S.W. at 9 A.M. saw sperm whales lowered the boats without success 1 P.M. headed to the S.W. Noon Lat 6-58 S. Long 87-10 West.

#109. Thursday 7th Light trades and pleasant headed to the S.W. employed breaking out and stowing between decks 3 P.M. saw sperm whales lowered the boats without success Noon Lat 6-58 S. Long 86-40. West.

#110. Friday 8th Light trades and pleasant daylight headed to the S.W. saw sperm whales lowered the boats struck one and the line parted. 10 A.M. came on board. saw more 11 A.M. lowered the boats - succeeded in taking two   3 P.M. got them alongside   Noon Lat 6-40 S. Long 86-20 West.

#111. Saturday 9th Light trades and pleasant daylight commenced cutting saw a ship to windward 9 A.M. saw sperm whales lowered the boats succeeded in taking one  finished the two whales boays 7 P.M. got the  whale alongside 10 P.M. commenced boiling, secured. Laying by with one whale and two heads alongside Noon Lat 6-30 S. Long 86-30 West.

#112. Sunday 10th Moderate and pleasant employed boiling and cutting in the two heads. plenty of whales in sight all day 4 P.M. lowered one boat without success. to end with one whale alongside Noon Lat 6-14 S. Long 86-23. West.

#113. Monday 11th Light air employed cutting and boiling finished cutting. braces forward headed to the S.W. by the wind fresh. Lat 6-20 Long 86-50.

#114. Tuesday 12th Light air and pleasant employed boiling saw a ship to windward noon Lat 6-45 S. Long 87-14. Lat 87-20 West.
