715. Wednesday 13th Light trades and fine weather headed to the E. at 2 A.M. finish boiling at 4 P.M. spoke the George & Susan of New Bedford. 25 Months 17 5/8. Noon Lat 6-15. Long at 2 P.M. for Lunar 87-23-15. Chron 86-35. West.

716 Thursday 14th Pleasant trades headed to the E. & S. by the wind employed stowing between decks saw black fish Noon Lat 6-28. S. Long 86-20 West.

717 Friday 15th Pleasant trades headed to the S. W. by the wind employed stowing between decks nothing in sight noon Lat by Acc. 6-20. Long at 4 P.M. Chron 85-53

718 Saturday 16th Moderate and pleasant headed to the E. & S. noon headed to the S. S. W. saw two ships on the weather beam. Employed stowing between decks. Noon Lat 6-20 S. Long at 4 P.M. Chron 86-24 W

719 Sunday 17th Moderate headed to the E. & S. Employed stowing between decks saw 3 ships headed to the S. W. by the wind finish stowing Noon Lat 6-35 S. Long at 4 P.M. 86-10 W.

720 Monday 18th Strong trades and pleasant headed to the S. S. W. Employed cleaning ship saw blackfish Noon Lat 6-35 S. Long 86-20

721 Tuesday 19th Fresh trades and cloudy daylight headed to the S. E. at 9 A.M. saw a ship at 5 P.M. spoke her the Cambria of New Bedford 7 Months 13 1/2. Noon Lat 7-6 S. Long 86-50 W

722 Wednesday 20th Moderate and pleasant headed to the S. E. by the wind saw 2 ships headed to the S. E. Noon wore ship look S. S. W. plenty of blackfish in sight noon Lat 6-05 Long 86

723 Thursday 21st Fresh trades daylight headed to the E. & S. W. The ship Cambria of the tea bow also another ship off the weather beam. Sunset wore ship to the S. S. W. Lat 6-27 S. Long 85-27

724 Friday 22nd Fresh trades and pleasant headed to the S. W. by the wind passed a ship headed to the N. E. saw finbacks and black fish. Sunset wore ship to the E. & S. Noon Lat 7-05 S. Long 86-38 W.

725 Saturday 23rd Moderate trades and pleasant headed to the Eastward at 7 A.M. passed a ship steering to the S. W. Nothing in sight between Noon Lat 7-07 S. Long at 5 P.M. Chron 85-36 W.

726 Sunday 24th Moderate and pleasant headed to the S. S. W. at 1 P.M. headed to the E. & S. at 3 P.M. saw a ship off the tea bow also finbacks. S. all hands at leisure. Noon Lat 7-57 S. Long at 4 P.M. Chron 85-32

727 Monday 25th Moderate and pleasant headed to the S. S. W. by the wind blackfish in sight the ship Cambria in sight steering to the S. S. W. Employed in sundries ship duty Noon Lat 8-30 S. Long Chron 86-03 West.

728 Tuesday 26th Moderate and pleasant headed to the S. S. W. the ship Cambria off our weather bow (noon) she made signal for whals off her lee beam at 1 P.M. she lowered her boats at 3 P.M. lowered our boats succeeded in taking one at 4 P.M. got the whale alongside. The ship ~~got nothing~~ at 4 P.M. got nothing. Noon Lat 9-54 Long 87 West.

729 Wednesday 27th Moderate and pleasant daylight commenced cutting 10 A.M. finish. Made sail headed to the S. S. W. Noon began to boil. Sunset wore ship to the E. & S. Noon Lat 9-55 S. Long at 4 P.M. Chron 87-14 W.

730 Thursday 28th Light trades and pleasant daylight headed to the S. S. W. Employed boiling noon headed to the Eastward and finish boiling. Nothing in sight to starboard. Noon Lat 10-06 S. Long at 4 P.M. Chron 87-14 West.
