749. Tuesday 17th. Strong trades and pleasant, headed to the S. E. W. The ship boreal in sight at 4 p.m. kept off N. W. saw blackfish. Noon. Lat 10-42 S. Long 84-10 West.

750. Wednesday 18th. Moderate and pleasant, steering to the N. E. W. Employed fitting rigging saw finbacks. Noon. Lat 9-23 S. Long 84-30 West.

751. Thursday 19th. Pleasant trades steering to the N. E. W. Black fish and finbacks in sight. sunset. Haul to the N. E. W. Noon. Lat 7-49 S. Long 84-50 West.

752. Friday 20th. Moderate and pleasant, steering to the N. E. W. Employed in sundries ship duty at 3 p.m. saw a large sperm whale of the sea beam headed to windward lowered the boats. Without success. sunset. Came on board. Lat 6-55 S. Long 86-40 W.

753. Saturday 21st. Moderate and pleasant, headed to the S. E. W. by the wind. Noon kept off North saw one finback. sunset haul to the E. N. E. with the main topsail to the mast. Lat 7-18 S. Long 86-42 W.

754. Sunday 22nd. Strong trades and pleasant, daylight, brace fore to the E. N. E. nothing in sight. Noon Lat 6-26 S. Long 86-57 W. sunset wore ship to the S. E. W.

755. Monday 23rd. Fresh trades headed to the S. E. W. Employed fitting the fore and main topmast backstays. Nothing in sight. Noon Lat 6-56 S. Long 86-42 W. sunset wore ship to the E. N. E.

756. Tuesday 24th. Light trades and pleasant, daylight wore ship to the S. W. Noon headed to the E. N. E. sunset haul the main topsail to the mast. Noon. Lat 6-58 S. Long 87-03 West.

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757. Wednesday Dec 25th. Strong trades and clear. Headed to the E. N. E. at 8 A.M. saw a whale spout and left tail of the breacher. Beam tongs along the 9. tacked ship to the S. E. W. Noon tacked again to the E. N. E. saw no more of him. sunset to the in sail and hauled the main topsail to the mast. Noon. Lat 6-53 S. Long 86-30 W. Lunar Obs 9. A.M. 86-33-43. Chro 86-30-30.

758. Thursday 26th. Moderate and pleasant, headed to the E. N. E. saw plenty of blackfish sunset wore ship to the S. E. W. with the main topsail to the mast. Noon Lat 6-23 S. Long 86-57 W. Lunar Obs 7. A.M. 85-57-45. Chro 86-16-15 W.

759. Friday 27th. Fresh trades with passing squalls headed to the S. E. W. saw blackfish sunset wore ship to the E. N. E. with the main topsail to the mast. Noon Lat 6-29 S. Long 86-57 W.

760. Saturday 28th. Fresh trades and pleasant, headed to the E. N. E. saw blackfish. Noon Lat 6-16 S. Long 86-02-30 W.

761. Sunday 29th. Pleasant trades and clear weather, headed to the N. E. Nothing in sight. Noon Lat 5-36 S. Long 85-30-15 Chro 85-52-45.

762. Monday 30th. Fresh trades and pleasant, steering to the N. E. Nothing in sight. Employed in sundries ship duty. sunset took in sail with the main topsail to the mast. Noon Lat 4-21 S. Long 84-34-30. Chro 84-43-45 West.

763. Tuesday 31st. Moderate and pleasant, headed to the N. E. saw finbacks. Noon Lat 3-32 S. Long 83-57 W. Chro 83-57 West.
