

Ship. Charles. January. 1840

- 779 Thursday January 16th 1840 Fresh trades and pleasant & 2 A.M. headed to the S.E. W. employed mending the Blackfish blubber, made 5 lbs. Noon headed to the E.N.E. at 3 P.M. saw a ship standing to the S.E. W. Noon Lat 5-04 S. Long 4-47 W. Obs 86-43 W.
- 780 Friday 17th Fresh trades and clear & 2 A.M. headed to the S.E. W. employed mending the fore and main topgallant sails. & 2 P.M. headed to the E.N.E. Noon Lat 5-16 S. Long 4-48 W.
- 781 Saturday 18th Fresh trades and pleasant headed to the East, nothing at all in sight. Noon Lat 5-07 S. Long 5-05 W. Obs 85-35 W.
- 782 Sunday 19th Light trades and pleasant, midnight headed to the South. 8 A.M. headed to the E.N.E. Headed at leisure 3 P.M. headed to the South. Noon Lat 5-08 S. Long 5-06 W. Obs 85-25 W.
- 783 Monday 20th Fresh trades and pleasant headed to the S.E. employed mending the foresail. Noon headed to the N.E. by the wind & 2 P.M. passed a brig headed to the South & 4 P.M. bent the foresail. Noon Lat 5-12 S. Long 4-46 W. Obs 85-16 W.
- 784 Tuesday 21th Moderate and pleasant headed to the N.E. employed mending the foretopgallant and setting up casks for water. Saw blackfish. Noon Lat 5-23 S. Long 4-44 W. Obs 84-28 W.
- 785 Wednesday 22th Moderate and pleasant headed to the N.E. by the wind employed mending the main topgallant sail and setting up casks for water. Hunted, hauled the main topgallant sail to the mast. Noon Lat 4-50 S. Long 4-46 W. Obs 83-35 W.
- 786 Thursday 23th Moderate and pleasant headed to the E.N.E. employed setting up casks and sunning ship's duty. Noon Lat 4-04 S. Long 5-00 W. Obs 83-16 W. Obs 82-25 W. & 4 P.M. Obs 81-37 W. West without adding 30 miles.

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- 787 Friday Jan. 24th Moderate and pleasant headed E.S.E. by the wind daylight saw the Land. Noon in tide. Noon and tacked off shore. Cape Blanco bore East dist 15 miles. Employed setting up casks and starting bread. Noon Lat 4-22 S. Long 5-08 W. Obs 80-33 W. Obs 81-11 W.
- 788 Saturday 25th Moderate and pleasant daylight headed to the Eastward & 8 A.M. saw the Land & 10 A.M. tacked off N.E. for Kumbey. Employed in sundries, ship's duty. Noon Lat 4-16 S. Long 5-05 W. Obs.
- 789 Sunday 26th Light trades and pleasant daylight. Heeded of N.E. the Land in sight dist 20 miles & 3 P.M. passed a ship beating to windward. Got the Larboard anchor off the bow. Hunted, saw one ship to anchor off Kumbey River. Noon Lat 3-46 S. Long 5-07 W. Obs 80-38 W.
- 790 Monday 27th Calm and light airs & 11 A.M. took a breeze from N.W. Noon spotted the Ship Rousseau (Lucas) of New Bedford 38 months. 1600 lbs. & 4 P.M. Came to anchor in 4 fathoms water to the North of the Bay. Noon Lat 3-34 S. Long 5-09 W. Obs 80-28 W. Obs 80-6-43 W.
- 791 Tuesday 28th Employed cleaning and painting ship one boat crew cutting wood. and one boat crew watering & 2 P.M. a small schooner came to anchor.
- 792 Wednesday 29th Employed painting and getting of stores. Noon Lat 3-29 S.
- 793 Thursday 30th Finish painting the Larboard sides got one Board load of wood got the raft ashore on the Bay at low water. Unlashed the casks and rolled them up clear of the tide. Killed a bullock and brought him on board.
