 headed to S. S. W. Lat 5-30 S Long 85-30 W

932 Thursday 18th Moderate and pleasant headed to S. S. W.
 & 11 p.m. passed a ship off the Sea Beam. headed to N. E. by E.
 showed her signal white with a harpoon in the center
 & 2 p.m. saw a ship with the weather bow & 3 p.m. saw
 Whales ahead lowered the boats without success
 Noon Lat 5-40 S Long 85-50 W

933 Friday 19th Moderate and pleasant day light made
 sail headed to E. N. E. a ship on the weather quarter cutting
 & 9 A.M. tacked ship to S. S. W. saw two more ships also
 Finbacks and Blackfish Noon Lat 6. 00 S Long 86. W

934 Saturday 20th Moderate and pleasant headed to E. N. E.
 & 8 A.M. passed the Ship Nile. Noon tacked ship to
 S. S. W. saw Finback's Hunter spoke the Ship Nile. (State)
 of N. B. Woolles. Noon Lat 5-18 S Long 85-40 W

935 Sunday 21st Moderate and pleasant headed to S. W. by W.
 by the wind saw finbacks all hands at leisure
 Noon Lat 6. 02 S Long 87-10 W

936 Monday 22nd Moderate and pleasant headed to N. E. by E.
 saw a ship headed to S. W. by S. saw Blackfish and Finback's
 Noon Lat 6. 24 S Long 85-40 W

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937 Tuesday June 23rd Moderate and pleasant headed S. W. by S. by the
 Wind saw Blackfish and Finbacks employed in ship's duty
 Long p. Lunar Obs. & 10 A.M. 86. 10. 30 W. Chs 85-48 W Lat 6. 06

938 Wednesday 24th Moderate and pleasant headed S. W. by S. by the
 Wind saw a ship in the weather bow headed to the North & East & when
 tacked to the N. E. by the wind employed making a deep sea line
 & 3 p.m. spoke the Franklin of N. B. (Kissale). 32nd boat 1700
 Noon Lat 6. 47 S Long p. Lunar Obs. 87-04 W Chs 84. 11. W

939 Thursday 25th Moderate Trade and pleasant headed
 to N. E. by E. by the Wind day light the Ship Franklin of the
 Sea Beam. employed in ship's duty & 3 p.m. passed 2 ships
 in our weather beam. one showed her signal white blue border
 with a letter other p. on it Noon Lat 6. 09 S Long 86-20 W

940 Friday 26th Moderate and pleasant steering by the Wind to the
 North & East the Ship Franklin in sight & 11 A.M. passed a
 bark steering to the S. W. & 3 p.m. saw a ship steering N. W.
 saw plenty of Blackfish & 5 p.m. lowered 2 boats for Blackfish
 without success. Noon Lat 5-30 S Long 84-56 W

941 Saturday 27th Moderate and pleasant headed to the N. E.
 the Ship Franklin off the Sea Beam & 9 A.M. saw a bark off
 the Sea Beam heading for it saw no more of it saw 2 ships a-
 head & 3 p.m. hauled by the wind to the N. E. & 4 p.m. spoke the
 Ship Augusta (Lawrence) of N. B. Franklin (Kissale) of N. B.
 the Ship Ephraim to leeward. Noon Lat 5-16 S Long 84-77 W

942 Sunday 28th Moderate trade and fair weather headed
 to the N. E. saw Blackfish and finbacks also 4 ships in
 sight the Ephraim, Franklin, and Augusta. to leeward and
 another steamer to leeward. sunset two ship to the S. W.
 Noon Lat 4-46 Long p. Chs 83-16 W
