Tuesday November 20th 1856

These 24 hours begins with strong gals
from E.S.E. heading S.W. close reef top sails

squalls of rain lat ten point cleared of
winds from E to S.E. saw one fire boat

Wednesday November 21st

This day begins with strong winds
from the S.S.E. heading E. staggered
midlle point squally with rains
close reef the top sails lat ten point the
same at 9 took wor ship to the south winds
from E.S.E. to S.E. strong gals soled this day.

These 24 hours begins with strong gals
from E.S.E. heading S.W. close reef top sails
at 8 P.M. took in fore top sail and fore
sail strong gals with heavy squalls at 3 P.M.

steering N.E. by N soled this day
