this day begins with a strong breeze from the SSW
steering SSW at 6 pm the island came in
SSE by 20 miles midle part lute winds
bedding to the south at day light made all
soil bedding for the land at 9 at had a thin
squall with rain wind from the SE to E at
noon cleared so ended this day

Tuesday February ^{the} 3 1854
this day begins with lute winds from the
SSW steering in for the harbor at 5 pm
came to an anchor in 4 or 5 fathoms of water
midle part calms but ten part in play in
towing the riggon so ended this day

Wednesday February ^{the} 4 1854
laying at anchor at anchor got of 7 cask
of water finished towing midle part
fine weather but ten part the same so ended

Thursday February ^{the} 5 1854
this day begins with fine weather laying at
an anchor midle part moderate but ten
part the same at 11 at took the anchor
came to see bedding by the raind SE once
soil in site so ended this day

Friday February ^{the} 6 1854
this day begins with fine weather
midle part lute winds calms but ten part lute
winds at 11 at cleared of lute winds from SSW
bedding to the SE so ended this day

Saturday February ^{the} 7 1854
this day begins with fine weather bedding
by the raind to the SE midle part the same
but ten part fine weather at 10 at late
squall of rain saw noth thing but porpoises

Sunday February ^{the} 8 1854
this day begins with lute winds calms at
1 pm lute winds from south by W bedding
SE to SE midle part the same but ten part fine
weather at 5 at saw the land the coast so ended this day

Monday February ^{the} 9 1854
there 24 hours begins with fine weather bedding
in shore at 1 pm tack of to the W by S at mid night
tack in shore at day light the land in site of the la
rough at 6 at took tack to the W by S so ended

Tuesday February ^{the} 10 1854
this day begins with fine weather bedding of to the
SSW at 4 pm tack ship to the SE one sail in
site to the south of steering W by W midle part
fine weather at 6 at took tack ship to the SSW at
9 saw a hump back so ended this day

Wednesday February ^{the} 11 1854
this day begins with brisk breezes bedding to
the SSW by S at 2 pm saw black fish leaved for
them got three took them in at 4 pm saw black
leaved got noth thing at 8 am set brisk breezes
bedding SSW midle part lute winds at 9 at took
tack ship to the SE at 10 tack to the SSW by S
brisk breezes in play in sailing so ended
