

Thursday April ^{The} 1 1858

This day began with light winds the boat went on shore in the day At 4 pm came of course down with strong trade the day of shore At 6 pm saw breeches of shore of us middle point fine breezes latter part the same saw nothing thing so kind this day

Saw 6 miles distance

Friday April ^{The} 2

This day began with smoky weather rain down the bay to the W at sunset shortened sail of shore midlle point light winds At 6 pm took of shore At 11 pm took to the W in shore saw nothing so kind

Saw 20 miles of

Saturday April ^{The} 3

This day began with brisk breezes from the S & S by ding in 1st At 4 pm got in shore saw the other George to anchor took of to the S & S at sunset shortened sail the day middle point fine weather but too point the same saw nothing thing of to the W & W so kind this day

The land 8 miles dist

Sunday April ^{The} 4

This day began with fine weather At 2 pm saw a whaling schooner steering to the W & W At sunset shortened sail the day of shore midlle point light winds but too point the same saw nothing but grampuses so kind

Monday April ^{The} 5

This day began with light breezes from S & S midlle point fine weather but too point the same saw grampuses but no whales this day a long shore to the S & S employed in fitting the new foresail so kind this day

Tuesday April ^{The} 6 1858

This day began with strong breezes smoky even then saw to whalers came in to the S & S schooners At sunset shortened sail but the new foresail midlle point brisk breezes the wind came from the W with rain At 10 pm cleared off daylight made all sail the day in shore At 8 pm saw whales but got none of them At 11 got them along side

Wednesday April ^{The} 7

This day began with light winds At 8 pm finished cutting down whales to the S & S of us to anchor for them didn't get to them light winds for W & W midlle point calm At daylight calm At 9 pm light winds from W saw black fish grampuses employed in boiling

Thursday April ^{The} 8

This day began with fine weather employed in boiling winds from S & S by ding to the S & S saw breeches run for them saw nothing more of them At sunset shortened sail lay in a look midlle point strong wind but too point fine weather At 11 pm spoke the schooner Samuel Roper of Providence 2 months out

Friday April ^{The} 9

This day began with light winds from all quarters with a strong S & W at middle point strong breezes the day in shore At daylight calm and sail in site At 11 am light wind from W steering a long shore to the S & S so kind this day
