Sunday
April 14
1837

First Part Mercant began
from the S & steering N by E
saw a shoal of white fish
& caught 3 of them
Middle Part cloudy
weather steering S by E
Latter Part strong trade
& cloudy Lat 16 44 S
Long 96 00 W

Monday
April 15
1837

First Part strong trade
from the S & steering N by E
at sunset shortened sail
Middle Part strong
trade Latter Part
made sail saw the land
Lat 15 00 S
Long 95 10 W

Tuesday
April 16
1837

First Part strong trade
from the S & steering N
employed in ship's duty
at sunset kept up the
Middle Part
strong trade
Latter Part
pleasant employed in
ship's duty Lat 14 15 S
Long

Saturday
May 12
1837

First Part of the 21 having
strong trade saw a ship to
leeward beating up
Latter Part employed
in getting up gear from the
shore at 10 P M the ship
Sleazner Captain Capt Baker
came to anchor & made out
no talk of oil

Sunday
May 13
1837

First Part fine weather
employed in getting up potatoes
one watch on shore
Latter Part gathering
worthy of note occurred

Monday
May 14
1837

First Part strong trade &
pleasant weather at 3 P M a
Persian vessel came to
anchor Latter Part employed
in getting up remains one watch
on shore

Tuesday
May 15
1837

First Part fine weather
employed in blacking the hull
& varnishing the rigging
Latter Part employed
in various jobs of ship's
duty Latter Part
strong trade Lat 14 20 S
Long 98 18 W
