June 9th
(1833)
First Port fine pleasant weather saw a number of ships Middle Port strong trades Latter Port spoke the ship *Phonograph* Vanhooket Capt. M. M. M. 12 miles out - 400 lbs

Monday
June 10th
(1833)
First Port light breezes at 4 PM spoke the ship *Phonograph* Vanhooket Capt. M. M. M. 10 miles out Middle Port tacked ship Latter Port pleasant under all sails

Tuesday
June 11th
(1833)
First Port pleasant under all sails Middle Port light breezes Latter Port saw a school of whales lowered and got 2 and took them alongside L.B. 30 lbs

June 12th
(1833)
First Port employed in killing one whale Middle Port Latter Port finished killing saw more whales

June 13th
(1831)
First Port pleasant saw 1 whale lowered and got one Latter Port employed in boiling Latter Port spoke the ship *Phonograph* Vanhooket Capt. M. M. M. 9 miles out 270 lbs

June 14th
(1831)
First Port employed in boiling tacked ship lie up N.E. Middle Port boiling Latter Port fine weather

Saturday
June 15th
(1831)
First Port fine pleasant weather at 2 PM saw whales to windward but did not lower finished boiling Middle Port spoke the ship *Phonograph* Vanhooket Capt. M. M. M. 21 miles out 1000 lbs

June 16th
(1831)
First Port strong trades under short sail lie up N.E. Middle Port much the same Latter Port pleasant saw 2 ships to windward
