1834

First Part pleasant breezes under all sail stowing with nothing
Middle Part fine weather under all sail
Later Part pleasant employment in various jobs of ship duty

April 8th
1834

First Part of this 24 hours commenced with fine breeze and pleasant weather under all sail stowing with employment in ship duty
Middle Part pleasant
Later Part fine weather set main top gallant and lower stowing sail and main reefed
Lat 2-15 S
Long 120-58 W

Wednesday
April 9th
1834

First Part of this 24 hours fine breeze pleasant under all sail stowing with the hand on the main top mast
Middle Part light breeze
Later Part fine pleasant weather employment in various jobs of ship duty
Lat 01-21 S

Thursday
April 10th
1834

First Part pleasant breezes under all sail stowing with employment in ship duty
Middle Part fine weather
Later Part pleasant under all sail
Lat 00-42 S
Long 122-09 W

Friday
April 11th
1834

First Part fine breezes from the S.E. stowing with under all sail employment in ship duty saw a shoal of black fish
Middle Part light breeze
Later Part employment in mending sails
Lat 00-00

Saturday
April 12th
1834

First Part light breezes and pleasant weather under all sail stowing with employment in mending the main top sail
Middle Part light breeze
Later Part fine weather finished mending sails so ends all well
