

Remarks on Board Ship Charles Henry Bound to Japan May 1874

Sunday
May 11
1874
First Part strong trade steady
Wind took in and made sail
accordingly at 2 PM came to
anchor at Roanoke in 16 fathoms
Later Part strong
trade at 11 AM got under way
for sea in company with the
Zenas Coffin Capt Coleman 23
out 1050 lbs of oil

Monday
May 12
1874
First Part strong trade and clear
weather steering W by S at 6 PM
reapt the fore & mizzen top sail
Middle Part took in
the main top gallant sail
Later Part strong
trade employed in ships duty
Lat 20-30 N
Long

Tuesday
May 13
1874
First Part strong trade and
employed in ships duty at 4 PM
spoke the Zenas Coffin Capt
Coleman 24 masts out 1050 lbs
Middle Part fine
weather steering W by S
Later Part light breeze and
in ships duty
Lat 20-30 N
Long 161-55 W

Wednesday
May 14
1874
First Part of this 24 hours commenced
with light breeze from the ENE
steering W by S employed in various jobs
of ships duty Middle Part pleasant
Zenas Coffin in company
Later Part fine weather
employed in tacking the rigging and
painting the spars
Lat
Long

Thursday
May 15
1874
First light breeze and pleasant
made all sail steering W by S
employed in painting and various
other jobs Middle Part
pleasant Zenas Coffin in company
Later Part light breeze
set the fore & main top steering sail
employed in painting
Lat 20-11 N
Long 165-55 W

Friday
May 16
1874
First Part light breeze from
the ENE steering W by S on bent the
main top sail and bent another
Middle Part pleasant
Zenas Coffin in company
Later Part fine
weather employed in painting
Lat 19-55 N
Long
