Thursday Sept 18 1834
 First Part pleasant breeze from the
 S.W. steering E.S.E. at sunset took
 sail Middle Part light breeze
 up of Latter Part pleasant
 steering down in the fore hold
 Lt 29-08 M
 Log 161-13 8

Friday Sept 19 1834
 First Part fine pleasant weather at
 2 PM spoke the Corinther left Gre
 ad no oil sense we parted finished
 steering down Middle Part
 light air Latter Part pleasant
 spoke the Rebecca Sims at 2 PM
 left Luffin 25 Mths out 2000 lbs
 Lt 29-16 M
 Log

Saturday Sept 20 1834
 First Part pleasant breeze from
 the S.W. steering E.S.E. to S.W. on
 Corinther in company
 Middle Part light breeze
 Latter Part strong wind made
 sail saw a ship to windward a
 hailing
 Lt
 Log

Sunday Sept 21 1834
 First Part strong wind from
 the N.W. to E. to S.W. in company
 at 6 PM saw another ship ahead
 Middle Part pleasant
 Latter Part saw whales however
 but did not catch them
 Lt
 Log

Monday Sept 22 1834
 First Part pleasant saw 3 ships
 at 4 PM hoveed again for whales
 at struck one got one boat store
 lost him by the iron drawing
 Middle Part sea up
 Latter Part saw more whales
 however but did not catch them
 Daniel Webster in company with
 400 lbs
 Lt
 Log

Tuesday Sept 23 1834
 First Part saw whales at 4 PM
 spoke the James Cobbin of London
 Capt Mann 25 Mths out 900 lbs a
 large whale along side
 Middle Part sea up
 at 2 PM touched ship to up S.E.
 Latter Part pleasant made all
 sail 3 ships in sight
 Lt 28-30 M
 Log

Wednesday Sept 24 1834
 First Part light air to up of E on
 at 1 PM touched ship
 at sunset shortened sail
 Middle Part calm
 Latter Part fine pleasant weather
 under all sail steering E.S.E.
 crushed in mending the stern
 boat
 Lt 29-06 M
 Log
