Sept 25
1833
First Part of the 24 hours fine breeze from S. by E. ship in sight at sunset took in sail. Middle Part squally. Latter Part strong winds from the S.W. some sail. Lat 27-58 N. Long 163-30 E.

Friday
Sept 26
1833
First Part strong winds from the S.W. stopping ship at sunset took in sail. Latter Part light breeze made some sail. Lat 28-32 N. Long

Saturday
Sept 27
1833
First Part fine weather made sail up. S. by E. the mizzen top sail went another at sunset took in sail. Latter Part squally. Latter Part strong gales from the S. by E. Lat 28-44 N. Long

Sunday
Sept 28
1833
First Part strong gales from the S. by E. ship at sunset took in the fore sail. Middle Part strong winds. Latter Part strong gales from the S. by E. Lat 29-19 N. Long

Sept 29
1833

Sept 30
1833
First Part of the 24 hours fine breeze from S. by E. ship in sight at sunset took in sail. Middle Part squally. Latter Part strong winds from the S.W. some sail. Lat 28-20 N. Long

Wednesday
Oct 1
1833
First Part of the 24 hours light breeze from S. by E. at 1 PM touched ship to up. Latter Part pleasant at 6 PM saw sperm whales lowered and got 1 and took him alongside. Lat

Thursday
Oct 2
1833
First Part Pleasant began to rain at 3 PM saw more whales lowered and got one more took him alongside. Middle Part by the whales. Latter Part finished cutting him to bait. Lat 28-41 N. Long 165-31 E.
