the 24 hours commenced with fine  
Tuesday pleasant weather under all sail  
June employed in ship duty at sunset tacked  
2<sup>nd</sup> shift he up w<sup>b</sup> & shortened sail  
Middle Part strong trade he up w<sup>b</sup> & l<sup>g</sup>  
Latter Part pleasant made sail  
saw 2 ships Lat 5-00 S  
L<sup>y</sup>

First Part fresh gales from the  
Wednesday S<sup>b</sup> he up & employed in ship duty at  
June sunset hauled the light sails at  
7 PM tacked shift he up S  
Middle Part strong gales  
Latter Part made some sail at  
10 AM tacked shift he up w<sup>b</sup> saw one  
ship Lat 5-18 S  
L<sup>y</sup> 103-53 W

First Part of this 24 hours fine  
Thursday sawt weather he up w<sup>b</sup> employed in  
June coopering oil for stowing down  
Middle Part especially Latter Part  
pleasant employed in stowing down  
in the fore hold saw one ship  
Lat 4-34 S  
L<sup>y</sup>

First Part pleasant breeze he up  
Friday w<sup>b</sup> finished stowing down  
June & washed up the deck Middle Part  
light breeze Latter Part pleasant  
made all sail tacked shift he up  
S<sup>b</sup> employed in varnishing  
the ship waist Lat 4-25 S  
L<sup>y</sup> 103-04 W

First Part light breeze and pleasant  
Saturday he up S<sup>b</sup> employed in ship duty saw  
June 3 ships Middle Part spoke the American  
of Nutsan Capt Dolger 21 Thos put  
400 lbs and the Pioneer of N<sup>B</sup> Capt  
Russel 7 tons 150 lbs Latter Part  
pleasant tacked shift he up w<sup>b</sup> saw  
2 ships Lat 4-44 S  
L<sup>y</sup>

First Part of this 24 commenced with  
Sunday very fine weather under all sail he up  
June w<sup>b</sup> at sunset shortened sail  
Middle Part tacked shift he up S<sup>b</sup>  
Latter Part pleasant made all sail  
he up S<sup>b</sup> Lat 4-44 S  
L<sup>y</sup> 103-21

First Part pleasant under all sail  
Monday he up at 4 PM spoke the American  
June at 5 PM saw sperm whales  
but did not catch them  
Middle Part tacked shift he up w<sup>b</sup> saw  
one ship Latter Part strong trade  
tacked he up S Lat 5-25 S  
L<sup>y</sup> 104-03 W

First Part fine pleasant weather  
Tuesday under all sail employed in various  
June jobs saw 2 ships to leeward  
Middle Part spoke the Tobacco Plant  
of N<sup>B</sup> Capt Swain 9 1/2 tons 200 lbs  
& the Pioneer 120 lbs Latter Part  
pleasant under all sail he up  
at 10 AM tacked shift he up S  
saw 2 ships Lat 5-05 S  
L<sup>y</sup>
