Friday Sept 13 1837
 First Part strong trade from West
 wind 6-8 at 3 to 4. Wind up to 10 at
 6 to 8 at 6 to 8 at 6 to 8 at 6 to 8 at
 Middle Part strong breeze light air
 6 leagues. Middle Part trade wind
 Light. Latter Part pleasant wind 5 to 8
 10 to 11 at 11
 Light

Saturday Sept 14 1837
 First Part strong trade steering E by N
 for Pata head. saw a ship standing
 up shore at 1 PM came to anchor
 in Pata harbor in 10 fathoms water.
 Middle Part light air. Latter Part
 pleasant employed in various parts
 of ship duty

Sunday Sept 15 1837
 First Part strong trade and clear
 employed in scraping and varnishing
 the breast and painting the stern
 Middle Part pleasant
 Latter Part employed painting the
 ships shears came to anchor.

Monday Sept 16 1837
 First Part employed in setting up
 rigging at 2 PM the ship Rossie
 came to anchor. Middle Part
 light air. Latter Part employed
 in ship duty

Tuesday Sept 17 1837
 First Part strong trade employed
 in ship duty and watch on shore
 Middle Part light breeze
 Latter Part employed in ship
 duty the ship Lima got underway
 for sea

Wednesday Sept 18 1837
 First Part strong trade and pleasant
 employed in ship duty and watch
 on shore. Middle Part light breeze
 Latter Part pleasant employed in
 ship duty

Thursday Sept 19 1837
 First Part strong gales and choppy
 weather employed in getting up
 19 recruits. Middle Part strong
 trade. Latter Part pleasant and watch
 on shore

Friday Sept 20 1837
 First Part strong trade and pleasant
 weather employed in various parts of ship
 duty. Middle Part pleasant. Latter Part
 much the same and watch on shore

Saturday Sept 21 1837
 First Part strong trade nothing up
 occurred. Middle Part the same
 Latter Part pleasant

Sunday Sept 22 1837
 First Part strong trade and pleasant
 at 2 PM the George & Susan came to
 anchor 23 Mths out 600 lbs and a
 merchant ship from Calico.
 Middle Part pleasant. Latter Part
 employed in ship duty

Monday Sept 23 1837
 First Part strong trade a merchant ship
 and Brig got under way for sea
 Middle Part pleasant. Latter Part
 much the same at noon the
 Maria of Nantucket Capt. Macey
 came in 25 Mths out 1700 lbs
 J.L.
