

Wednesday Sept 16th

The watch was busy setting up rigging and sending down the main spencer gaff and spliced it and sent it up again and we raised a sail on our lee beam took in the mizen topgallant sail at 5 P.M. and saw a piece of timber on our lee beam steering S. E. by W. wind E. S. E.

So ends these 24 hours

Thursday Sept 17th

We called all hands and enabled under the fore and main topsail and furled the mainsail and mizen topsail we was steering S. E. E. and the wire was W. by S. Samuel Thompson fell from the foretop sail yard down in the forewiring

So ends these 24 hours

Friday Sept 18th

The watch employed in ship's duty we raised the lane on the larboard bow we was steering E. by N. and raised a sulphur bottom on the larboard beam we saw a sail on the larboard bow steering E. by N. wind S. by E.

So ends these 24 hours

Saturday Sept 19th

We made the island of Small 4 P.M. on the larboard bow about 50 miles off we made 3 rocks and patches in the harbour saw two ships laying at anchor and two brigs laying off and on wind S

So ends these 24 hours

Sunday Sept 20th

All hands employed in getting of recruits and we shipped 3 men and then got under way about two P.M. the way every way

So ends these last 24 hours

Monday Sept 21st

The watch employed in taking care of the recruits we reefed the main top sail about half past 7 A.M. steering S. by W. wind S. W.

So ends these 24 hours

Tuesday Sept 22nd

The watch was employed in ship's duty about 11 A.M. we saw a sail on our starboard beam we raised a school of Black fish and called all hands and lowered away the boats but did not get fast to them steering S. by W. wind S. S. W.

So ends these 24 hours

Wednesday Sept 23rd

All hands employed in setting up rigging at about 11 A.M. we saw a sail on the larboard beam about 11 A.M. raised a school of Black fish and we lowered away for them but did not get nigh them and returning to the ship the waist boat struck a bow fish which stove down 2 qts of oil wind S. E.

So ends these 24 hours

Thursday Sept 24th

All hands employed in setting up rigging we saw a sail on the larboard beam we saw a school of Black fish on our weather beam going very quick to the windward wind S. S. E.

So ends these 24 hours

Friday Sept 25th

All hands employed in ship's duty we saw a school of black fish leaved and did not get any and returned to the ship and then broke out the fore hole for firing gear rigging steering S. by W. wind S. E.

So ends these 24 hours
