Thursday April the 29<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours commenced with a fine breeze and equally weather saw 3 right whales lowered among the boats but come to the ship without success middle and latter part foggy and raining  
Lat 48° 45' Long 160. 00.

Friday April the 30<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S.W. middle and latter part much the same bearing S.W.  
Lat 49° Long

Saturday May the 1<sup>st</sup>

These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the S.W. leading N.W. middle part at sunset took in sail with rainy weather latter part light winds and cloudy weather at daylight made all sail starting S.W. by W.  
Lat 50° 50'

Sunday May the 2<sup>nd</sup>

These 24 hours commenced with light breeze from the S.E. to starting S.W. by W. with cloudy weather middle part at sunset took in sail latter part calm at 6 P.M. turned the reefs out the foretopail at 9 P.M. lased the main sail starting S.W. by W.  
Lat 51° 51' Long

Monday May the 3<sup>rd</sup>

These 24 hours commenced with light breeze from the Westward standing S.W. by W. under all at sunset took in sail starting S.W. by W. with light breeze from the S.E. middle part fine latter the same at day light made sail standing S.W. by W. at 8 P.M. saw finback  
Lat 51° 51' Long

Tuesday May the 4<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the S.E. standing S.W. by W. at 1 P.M. saw right whales so thick to lower middle part the same latter part light winds and fine weather saw right whales lowered 3 boats 1 boat struck and got stove took the whale along side and commenced cutting in  
Lat 53° 16'

Wednesday May the 5<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours commenced with light winds from the Southward finished cutting the whale standing S.W. middle part moderate breeze latter strong breeze at daylight saw right whales at 6 P.M. lowered 3 boats but returned to the ship without success  
Lat 52° 59' Long

Thursday May the 6<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours commenced with strong breeze from the S.E. standing to the Eastward at 3 P.M. saw right whale lowered 3 boats
