Friday May the 7th

These 24 hours commences
-es with fine breezes from the Westward
-heading W. S. W. at 3 P.M. the
boats and without success returned to
the ship at sunset took in sail
middle part a gale from the S. E.
-heading to the Westward at 5 A.M.
-saw right whales lowered the boats
but did not get any Lat Long

Saturday May the 8th

These 24 hours
commences with a moderate gale from
the S. E. heading to the Westward at
sunset were ship to the Eastward
heading E. by N. middle and latter part
more moderate at 7 A.M. were ship
to the Westward heading W. S. W. at 10
A.M. saw right whales and lowered 3 boats
but without success returned to the ship
Lat 53, 25' Long

Sunday May the 9th

These 24 hours commences
-es with a moderate breeze from
the S. E. heading to the Westward
at 3 P.M. lowered the boats returned to
the ship again without success

On the North West coast

at sunset took in sail middle and
latter part more moderate at 6 A.M.
steered S. W. until 7 A.M. were
ship to the Eastward with cloudy
weather Lat Long

Monday May the 10th

These 24 hours
commences with strong breezes from
the South heading E. boiling the
Whale middle and latter part
more moderate but cloudy saw
Whalbacks Lat Long

Tuesday May the 11th

These 24 hours
commences with moderate breezes
from the South heading to the
Eastward under Foresail and main
and mizzen Topsail middle
part moderate weather latter
part at 4 A.M. made sail at
5 A.M. saw right whales and at
6 A.M. lowered away but returned
to the ship without success
with light breezes from the S. E.
heading S. W. Lat Long

Wednesday May the 12th

These 24 hours
commences with light breezes
from the S. E. heading S. W. with
cloudy weather at sunset took in
sail middle and latter part thick
and rainy at 6 A.M. made sail
with light breezes from the East
ward heading S. W. Lat Long
