Thursday May the 13th

These 24 hours commenced
with a light breeze and cloudy weather
from the S. S. E. middle part tacking
with the main-top-sail aback latter
part light breezes from the S. W.
heaving to the Eastward

lowered 4 boats but did not get him at 3 P.M.
back ship to the Westward at sunset took

weather latter part much the same with
snow at 11 P.M. saw right whales lowered
4 boats and got one whale

Saturday May the 15th

These 24 hours commenced
with strong breezes from the Westward
heading S. E. at 6 P.M. took the whale
longer and took in sail middle
part began to cut him in latter
part finished cutting with pleasant
weather heading to the Eastward

Sunday May the 16th

These 24 hours commen-
ced with
with a moderate breeze from the South
heading to the West tacking to wind
cutting the whale at 4 P.M. from
boat cutting, and more ship was
began to boiling middle and
latter part slight breeze at
4 P.M. saw right whale at 5 P.M.

Bledford Capt Coffin on the S. W. M. M.

made all sail and lowered 4
boats at 11 P.M. returned to the
ship with thick fog.

Monday May the 17th

These 24 hours commen-
ced with a strong breeze from the S.
at 1 P.M. heading S. E. at sunset took
in sail we were boiling the Whale
middle part a gale from the S. W. at
11 P.M. stopped boiling the Whale
latter part much the same heading
to the Southward on the larboard tack

Tuesday May the 18th

These 24 hours commenced
with a gale from the S. W. W.
heading S. E. on the larboard tack
middle and latter part boiling at 6
P.M. made sail with cloudy weather
the wind S. S. W. heading S. W.
on the same tack

These 24 hours
commenced with moderate breezes from
the S. S. W. heading S. W. on the
larboard tack with cloudy weather at
6 P.M. took in sail still boiling the
Whale middle and latter part cloudy

ship to the Eastward heading S. E.
at 11 P.M. spoke the ship Jasper of
New London at 11 P.M. were ship to the
Westward with foggy weather boiling
the whale at the same time
