Haven May the 21<sup>st</sup>

These 24 hours com-  
menced with a strong breeze from  
the S. E. heading S. W. with foggy  
weather at 1 P.M. saw one ship in  
sight to the leeward middle part fine  
latter part cloudy with a light breeze  
from the E. S. E. at 3 P.M. made  
sail heading E. by S. with one ship  
in sight stowing down the main  
hatchway Lat Long

Friday May the 21<sup>st</sup>

These 24 hours commen-  
ce with light breeze from the S. E.  
heading S. S. W. at 6 P.M. took in  
sail stowing down the main  
hatchway middle and latter part foggy  
and rainy weather at 10 P.M. wore  
ship to the N. E. Lat Long

Saturday May the 22<sup>nd</sup>

These 24 hours  
commenced with a fine breeze from  
the Southward and clear weather steering  
S. E. set the fore and mizen topsail  
at sunset took in sail heading S.  
E. by S. middle part a strong breeze  
latter part a fine breeze from the S.  
steering S. E. by E. finished stowing down  
oil Lat Long

Sunday May the 23<sup>rd</sup>

These 24 hours  
commenced with a fine breeze from  
the S. steering S. W. by W. at 12 finished  
stowing down oil at sunset took in  
sail heading S. S. W. middle and latter

part fine weather at 5 P.M. made sail  
steering S. S. W. at 10 P.M. saw right  
whales lowered 4 boats returned to the  
ship without success and then wore  
ship Lat 53.00 Long

Monday May the 24<sup>th</sup>

ce with moderate breeze from the  
southward steering S. S. W. at  
sunset took in sail and luffed to  
the wind heading S. by W. middle  
part cloudy latter part pleasant  
weather at 5 P.M. made sail  
saw humpbacks Lat 53.00 Long

Tuesday May the 25<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours  
commenced with a strong breeze  
from the S. E. steering S. S. W.  
at 3 P.M. saw right whales lowered  
3 boats at 5 P.M. saw right whales  
whales again lowered away but  
returned to the ship without success  
at sunset took in sail middle and  
latter part fine weather heading  
S. W. at 4 P.M. tacked ship steering  
S. S. W. with 2 ships in sight  
Lat 52.55 Long

Wednesday May the 26<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours  
commenced with a fine breeze from  
the S. E. heading S. E. middle and  
latter part fine weather at 7 P.M. saw  
right whales lowered 3 boats but returned  
back without success Lat 53.04 Long
