

The Ship Char Drew of New Bedford

Thursday May the 27th

These 24 hours commences with a strong breeze from the North heading to the Eastward with whales in sight lowered 3 boats but no success at sunset took in sail heading N. by E. middle and latter part fine weather at 3 A.M. made sail steering S. E. at 7 A.M. tack to the Westward with 2 ships in sight Lat 53.00 Long

Friday May the 28th

These 24 hours commences with a moderate breeze from the North steering by the wind to the Eastward with 2 ships in sight at 5 P.M. tacked ship to the Westward at 7 P.M. spoke the Ship Alexander (Brady) of Bremen Capt. Fish middle and latter part fine weather heading S. E. with 2 ships in sight Lat 53.50 Long

Saturday May the 29th

These 24 hours commences with a light breeze from the S. E. heading to the Eastward with one ship in sight middle and latter part cloudy weather at 8 A.M. tacked ship to the Westward with one ship in sight Lat Long

Sunday May the 30th

These 24 hours commences with a light breeze and cloudy weather at 2 A.M. wore ship to the Eastward heading S. E. by E. with one ship in sight at 4 P.M. saw right whales lowered 3 boats but returned to the ship again without success middle and latter part light breeze steering S. E. at 10 A.M. saw right whales lowered away ~~but did not succeed~~ and got one Lat Long

Monday May the 31st

These 24 hours commences with a light breeze from the N. E. W. at 1 P.M. took the whale along side at 2 P.M. began to cut in at 4 A.M. finished cutting and took in topgallant sails middle and latter part calm and foggy weather began to boil the whale at 11 A.M. set the topgallant sail and with a light breeze from the Southward steered S. E. at 1 saw a ship in sight Lat Long

Tuesday May the 1st 1847

These 24 hours commences with calm and foggy weather boiling the whale with one ship in sight middle and latter part calm heading to the eastward with 2 ships in sight at 10 A.M. set the topgallant sails and steered by the wind to the S. with a light Lat Long
