in sail at 4 P.M. wore ship heading  
S. blowing heavy middle and  
latter part much the same with  
clear weather at 5 P.M. wore ship  
to the Westward.

Wednesday June the 15<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours  
commenced with a moderate gale  
from the N.W. heading S. W. by  
W. at 4 P.M. more moderate made  
sail steering by the wind S. W.

wore ship to the Eastward heading  
S. by E. with foggy weather

Thursday June the 17<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours  
commenced with a gale from  
the S. E. heading to the Eastward  
middle part a strong breeze and  
clear weather latter part more  
moderate at 2 P.M. steered off  
S. S. E. at 3 P.M. saw a right  
whale lowered 4 boats and got fast  
but the iron dived out and lost  
the whale at 5 P.M. come to the  
ship without success with 1 ship in  
sight

Friday June the 18<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours  
commenced with a fine breeze  
from the S. E. steering S. E. by E.  
with plenty of finbacks in  
sight at 10 A.M. spoke the  
ship Brigganza of New Bedford  
at sunset took in sail middle  
and latter part fine and pleasant  
weather at 3 P.M. made sail and  
steered by the wind to the Eastward  
with one ship in sight.

Saturday June the 17<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours  
commenced with a fine breeze  
from the E. S. E. steering S. E.  
in company with the Brigganza  
and the Basket of Music with  
another one in sight at sunset  
took in sail steering S. E. middle  
and latter part calm with 3 ships  
in sight

Sunday June the 20<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours  
commenced with a light breeze  
from the S. E. steering S. E. under  
all sail with 3 ships in sight  
at sunset steering S. middle and  
latter part calm at 3 P.M. saw  
right whales lowered 1 boat at 5 P.M.  
come to the ship without success  
pleasant weather with 3 ships in  
sight
