at 9 A.M. closed reefed the main top  
sail and took in the fore topsail  
with rain Lat. Long.

Saturday June the 25<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours  
commenced with a gale from the  
Eastward heading S.E. with a  
whale alongside and boiling at 5 P.M.  
more moderate with rain middle and  
latter part calm at 8 A.M. began  
to cut the whale the N.W. coast  
in sight Lat 58.00 Long.

Sunday June the 27<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours  
commenced with a calm and cutting  
with fine weather at 5 P.M. finished  
cutting with the N.W. coast in  
sight 2 ships and a bark in  
sight at 7 P.M. more ship and  
made all sail middle and latter  
part a fine breeze from the N.  
at 11 A.M. saw right whales lowered  
1 boat but returned to the ship  
without success Lat Long.

Monday June the 28<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours  
commenced with a gale from the  
E.S.E. heading S.E. by E. at 1 P.M.  
commenced strong finished sewing  
down the main hatchway middle  
and latter part a strong gale  
from the Eastward heading S.E.  
and a boiling with whales in sight  
Lat Long.

Tuesday June the 29<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours commenced  
with a gale from the Eastward  
heading S.E. with rain and one ship  
in sight middle and latter part  
strong breeze at 12 noon ship to the  
Westward with 2 ships in sight.  
Lat Long.

Wednesday June the 30<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours  
commenced with a strong breeze  
from the Southward heading S.W.  
with rainy weather and a boiling  
with 2 ships in sight middle and  
latter part a gale from the E.S.E.  
heading S. at 11 A.M. spoke the ship  
Stigle Lat Long.

Thursday July the 1<sup>st</sup> 1847

These 24 hours  
commenced with a gale from  
the E.S.E. heading S. at 4 P.M. finished  
stowing down Crib at 6 P.M. took  
in the Fore sail middle and latter  
part more moderate at 6 A.M. at  
the Fore sail and mizen topsail  
at 11 A.M. spoke the ship Stigle  
Lat Long.

Friday July the 2<sup>nd</sup>

These 24 hours  
commenced with fine weather and  
a light breeze from the S. starting  
S.E. by E. with 4 ships in sight  
at 4 A.M. finished boiling and stowing  
down middle and latter part a light  
breeze at 8 A.M. saw right whales  
lowered and got one with 4 ships in  
sight Lat Long.
