Saturday July the 3^d

These 24 hours commenced with a calm at 1 P.M. began to cut in at 9 P.M. finished cutting the whale wore ship and made sail showing S.E. middle and latter part raining at 4 P.M. saw right whales lowered but did not get any with 1 ship in sight

Sunday July the 4th

These 24 hours commenced with a strong breeze from the S.E. and squally weather at 6 P.M. saw right whales and lowered 3 boats but returned back without success at 7 P.M. took in sail middle and latter part strong breeze at 4 A.M. saw right whales and lowered 4 boats at 7 A.M. returned back without success

Monday July the 5th

These 24 hours commenced with a light breeze from the S.W. heading S.W. at 4 P.M. saw right whales and lowered but did not get any at 7 A.M. took in sail middle and latter part fine and pleasant weather at 3 P.M. saw right whales and lowered 4 boats and took one to the ship at 6 P.M. began to cut at 11 P.M. finished cutting and lowered again with no luck with 10 ships in sight

Tuesday July the 6th

These 24 hours commenced with a light breeze from the S.E. heading to the Eastward at 4 A.M. began to boil out at sunset took in sail with 7 ships in sight middle and latter part fine and pleasant weather at 8 A.M. saw right whales lowered 1 boat and got fast but the whale sunk and they returned to the ship

Wednesday July the 7th

These 24 hours commenced with a light breeze from the Eastward heading in shore with 12 ships in sight at sunset took in sail heading S. middle and latter part a strong rain and foggy weather boiling with the land in sight

Thursday July the 8th

These 24 hours commenced with a light breeze from the Eastward heading S.E. at 3 P.M. wore ship in shore with one ship in sight boiling with pleasant weather at 6 P.M. wore ship to the Southward middle and latter part fine and pleasant at 4 P.M. saw right whales lowered 4 boats and got one and at 7 A.M. took ^{him} alongside and at 11 A.M. began to cut
