commences with fine weather wind
from the S.E. steering N.W. by E. at 1 P.M.

Saturday Jan the 1st 1848

These 24 hours
commences with a fine breeze from the
S.E. steering N.W. by E. at sunset shortened
sail middle and latter part squally of rain
steering the same at 5 P.M. made all sail
Lat 2.91' Long "

Sunday Jan the 2nd 1848

These 24 hours commences
with a strong breeze from the S.E. steering
N.W. by E. middle and latter part fine at 7
P.M. capt N.W. by E.
Lat 1.02' Long 1 21

Monday Jan the 3rd 1848

These 24 hours
commences with a fine breeze from the S.E.
steering N.W. by E. at 2 P.M. hauled up to
N.W. by E. at sunset shortened sail middle and
latter part strong breeze and fine weather
at 5 P.M. set the topgallant sails at 8 P.M. were

Thursday Jan the 4th 1848

These 24 hours
commences with a strong breeze from
the S.E. steering N.W. by E. at 3 P.M. huffed
up to N.W. by E. at sunset took in sail

at 5 P.M. made sail steering N.W. by E.
Lat 1.05' Long 1 25.5

Wednesday Jan the 5th 1848

These 24 hours
commences with a fine breeze from the
S.E. steering S.W. by W. with pleasant
weather at 4 P.M. wore ship to the S.E.
by the wind at sunset took in sail
middle and latter part moderate
weather at 5 P.M. made all sail steering
S.W. by W. at 7 P.M. took ship to S.E.
and shortened sail at 12 wore ship to S.E.
Lat " " Long "

Thursday Jan the 6th 1848

These 24 hours
commences with a moderate breeze from
the S.E. steering by the wind S.W. by E.
at sunset took in sail steering S.W. by E.
middle and latter part strong breeze
at 5 P.M. made sail and wore ship to
S.W. by E.
Lat 1.40' Long "

Friday Jan the 7th 1848

commences with a strong breeze from the S.E.
steering S.W. by E. at 1 P.M. took ship to S.W.
