Saturday Jan the 2<sup>d</sup> 1848

These 24 hours  
commence with a moderate breeze from  
the S.E. steering N.E. at sunset shortened  
sail with a strong breeze middle and  
latter part moderate weather at 5 AM. made  
all sail and wore ship to the Southward  
Lat. " " Long. "

Sunday Jan the 3<sup>d</sup> 1848

These 24 hours  
commence with a moderate breeze  
from the S.E. at 1 PM. tacked ship  
to S.S.E. at 2 saw black fish and  
lowered 4 boats but did not do anything  
middle and latter part fine breeze at 5  
AM. tacked ship to the Westward at 8  
wore ship to S.S.E. at 9 tacked ship to  
the Southward with a strong breeze  
Lat. 5.00 Long. 130.00

Monday Jan the 10<sup>th</sup> 1848.

These 24 hours  
commence with a strong breeze  
from the S.E. steering by the wind  
S. at 1 PM. tacked ship steering S.S.E.  
by the wind with fine weather middle  
and latter part moderate weather at 5  
AM. tacked ship heading S by the  
Lat. " " Long. 128.03

Thursday Jan the 11<sup>th</sup> 1848

These 24 hours  
commence with a strong breeze from  
the S.E. steering S by the wind with fine  
weather at 2 AM. wore ship to S.E.  
at 4 set the topgallant sails middle  
and latter fine  
Lat. " " Long. 130.38

Wednesday Jan the 19 1848

These 24 hours  
commence with a fine breeze from  
the S.E. steering S at 1 PM. wore ship  
to S.E. at 4 AM. saw black fish lowered 4  
boats but did not get any middle and  
latter part fine weather at 5 AM. tacked  
ship to South at 11 saw black fish  
again and lowered 4 boats but did not  
do any thing  
Lat. 3.06 Long. " "

Thursday Jan the 18<sup>th</sup> 1848

These 24 hours  
commence with a moderate breeze from  
the S.E. steering S. at 2 PM. saw black  
fish lowered 4 boats without success  
at 8 tacked ship middle and latter part  
moderate at 4 AM. light squalls of rain  
heading S.S.E. by the wind with all  
sail out  
Lat. " Long.

Friday Jan the 14<sup>th</sup> 1848

These 24 hours  
commence with a light breeze from the  
S.E. steering by the wind S.E. at 4 AM.  
tacked ship to N.E. by 6 middle part  
light breeze at 9 AM. wore ship heading S
