commences with a fine breeze from
the Eastward steering S.W. by W. at 4
P.M. the wind hauled to S.E. strong
breeze and squally weather middle part
at 9 P.M. took in the topgallant sail
and reefed the topsail latter part fine
and pleasant weather steering S.W. by W.

middle and latter part fine breeze
steering S.W. by W. at 9 P.M. on bent the

the Eastward steering for the Islands
at 4 P.M. saw the land of Owhyhee rainy
weather middle and latter part strong
breeze from the Eastward steering
West with one ship in sight bound
for Nowhee.

Tuesday March the 7th 1848

These 24 hours
commences with a calm middle and
latter part light breeze and fine
weather at 9 P.M. came to anchor at
Nowhee

Wednesday March the 8th 1848 we arrived at
Nowhee. to recruit ship and for to
give the crew few days liberty to
go on shore.

Thursday ~~the 9th~~ March the 10th at 10 P.M. we got
under way from Nowhee to go down to
Whahoo.

Friday March the 11th 1848

commences with
strong breeze at 8 P.M. sent a boat on
shore to Whahoo middle and latter part
laid off and on.
