

The Ship Charles-Drew of New Bedford left

Sunday March the 26<sup>th</sup> 1848

These 24 hours  
commences with a strong breeze from  
the N. N. W. steering by the wind S. E.  
at sunset wore ship to the Northward  
middle and latter part more moderate  
toward the reef end of the topsails  
Lat " " Long " "

Monday March the 27<sup>th</sup> 1848

These 24 hours  
commences with a strong breeze from  
the Eastward steering North. cloudy weather  
middle and latter part strong breeze  
at 4 P.M. ordered the Mizzen topsail to mend  
Lat " " Long " "

Tuesday March the 28<sup>th</sup> 1848

These 24 hours  
commences with a strong breeze from  
the Eastward steering N. W. at 6 P.M. bent  
the Mizzen topsail with wetting weather  
middle and latter part moderate breeze  
and foggy weather steering N. W.  
Lat 33° 31' Long " "

Wednesday March the 29<sup>th</sup> 1848

These 24 hours  
commences with a moderate breeze from  
the S. E. steering N. W. with foggy  
weather middle and latter part moderate  
at 9 P.M. ordered the main-sail to repair  
Lat 33° 36' Long " "

Thursday March the 30<sup>th</sup> 1848

These 24 hours  
commences with a fine breeze from the

Coffin bound to the North West coast

Southward steering N. W. at 4 P.M. bent  
the mainsail middle and latter part  
light breeze with rain and fog  
Lat " " Long " "

Friday March the 31<sup>st</sup> 1848

These 24 hours  
commences with a light breeze from  
the Southward steering N. W. with  
rain and foggy middle and latter part  
much the same  
Lat " " Long " "

Saturday April the 1<sup>st</sup> 1848

These 24 hours  
commences with a light breeze from  
the S. with foggy steering N. W. middle  
and latter part light breeze with rain  
and foggy at 3 P.M. carried away the Mizzen  
topsail yard  
Lat " " Long " "

Sunday April the 2<sup>d</sup> 1848

These 24 hours  
commences with a calm with rain and  
foggy at 4 P.M. a light breeze from the  
N. W. steering N. W. middle and latter  
part light breeze with foggy and rain  
Lat " " Long " "

Monday April the 3<sup>d</sup> 1848

These 24 hours  
commences with a moderate breeze from  
the S. E. steering N. W. middle part the  
same latter part strong breeze with  
clear weather steering N. W. by N.  
Lat " " Long " "
