

The Ship Charles Drew of New Bedford

Wednesday Apr. the 26th 1848

These 24 hours commences with a moderate breeze from the E.S.E. at 1¹/₂ P.M. saw right whales lowered 3 boats and got fast and cut the line and then got fast to another and he stove his boat and lost the whale and line and then took the stowen boat to the ship at 4 P.M. took in sail middle and latter part a gale from the E.S.E.

Thursday Apr. the 27th 1848

These 24 hours commences with a moderate gale from the Eastward with fog middle and latter part more moderate at 4 A.M. made sail at 7 A.M. saw a right whale lowered 2 boats and chased all in vain we came on board and shortened sail.

Friday Apr. the 28th 1848

These 24 hours commences with a strong breeze from the S.E. at 4 P.M. took in sail middle and latter part a gale with fog at 11 A.M. more moderate and clear

Lat. 52° 4' Long. " "

Saturday Apr. the 29th 1848

These 24 hours commences with a strong breeze from the S.E. at 4 P.M. saw right whales and one left in sight at 5 came in foggy middle and latter part a gale from

Capt Coffin on the North West coast

The Westward at 10 A.M. took in sail steering to the Eastward

Sunday Apr. the 30th 1848

These 24 hours commences with a light breeze from the S.E. the steering to the Westward at 3 P.M. took in sail with fog middle and latter part moderate breeze with fog at 10 A.M. clear weather and made sail

Lat 53° 2' Long. " "

Monday May the 1st 1848

These 24 hours commences with a gale from the S.E. at 1 P.M. wore ship heading S. at 4 A.M. in the fore sail with clear weather middle more moderate at 4 A.M. made sail steering N. by E. with weather

Tuesday May the 2nd 1848

These 24 hours commences with a moderate breeze from the S.E. the steering N. by E. at 1 P.M. saw right whales and lowered 2 boats and chased but all in vain we came on board and wore ship to N. by E. at sunset buffed in the wing to the Northward middle and latter part moderate breeze the wind changed to the Northward S.E. at 4 A.M. made sail and saw a right whale lowered 1 boat and at 6 lowered 2 boats but of no good and a snow storm
