

The Ship Charles-Drew of New Bedford

Monday May the 29th 1848

These 24 hours commences with a strong breeze from the E.S.E. steering S. by E. with cloudy and rainy weather at 4 P.M. were ship to the S. 2 ships in sight middle and latter part strong breeze with fog and rain still boiling.

Tuesday May the 30th 1848

These 24 hours commences with a strong breeze from the E.S.E. with fog and rain steering S.W. at 2 P.M. finished boiling the whale at 4 P.M. five saw right whales lowered 4 boats but could not get on middle and latter part moderate at 10 still saw right whales lowered 4 boats and got one

Lat. 58^o 06' Long. "

Wednesday May the 31st 1848

These 24 hours commences with a fine breeze from the Eastward at 12 took the whale along side at 1 P.M. commenced cutting at 6 P.M. finished cutting made short sail steering by the wind to the Eastward with one ship in sight middle and latter part fine saw whales

Thursday June the 1st 1848

These 24 hours commences with a light breeze from the Southward steering S.W. at 5 P.M. saw right whales but did not have after them at 7 spoke the Roman at 3 mad all sail at 4 still saw right whales lowered 4 boats saw nothing at 4 still lowered 4 boats and got fast and got 2 boats stove lost the whale and line

Friday June the 2nd 1848

These 24 hours commences with a fine breeze from the Westward steering S.W. at 4 P.M. saw right whale at 5 fell on side the main top sail and bent another with one ship in sight middle and latter part moderate weather at 4 P.M. saw Long right whale at 9 A.M. saw an other lowered 2 boat and got fast and the whale took the line and lost him with one ship in sight

Saturday June the 3rd 1848

These 24 hours commences with a strong breeze from the Eastward steering S. by E. with fog middle and latter part calm at 2 P.M. began to boil the whale at 3 still saw a right whale lowered 2 boats and saw nothing one ship in sight
