

Ship Charles-Drew of New-Bedford

Sunday June the 4th 1848

These 24 hours commences with a light breeze from the S steering N. with a ship in sight at 7 P.M. calm weather a looking the whole middle and latter part calm with plenty of whales in sight at 4 P.M. lowered one boat but did not get on at 8 P.M. lowered 2 boats and chased with no success

Monday June the 5th 1848

These 24 hours commences with a calm at 4 P.M. had a light breeze from the S.E. steering to the Southward sailing with whales in sight and one ship a looking at 7 P.M. finished hoisting and took in sail steering to the Northward middle and latter part strong breeze wind S.E. steering North at 4 P.M. made all sail with one ship in sight

Lat 58° 55' Long . . .

Tuesday June the 6th 1848

These 24 hours commences with a strong breeze from the S.E. steering N. with one ship in sight at 1 P.M. wore ship at 4 spoke the ship Braganza of New Bedford Capt. Deval with 2500 bbls at 9 P.M. took in sail middle and latter part rain and fog at 4 P.M. made sail

Capt Coffin on the North West Coast

Wednesday June the 7th 1848

These 24 hours commences with a strong breeze from the Eastward with rain and fog one ship in sight at 8 P.M. took in sail middle part at 9 saw right whale moderate weather latter part much the same at 8 P.M. saw a right whale lowered one boat and chased but done nothing at 9 saw another lowered 2 boats and chased done nothing

Lat 57° 41' Long . . .

Thursday June the 8th 1848

These 24 hours commences with a light breeze from the N.W. steering S.E. one ship in sight at 1 P.M. saw a right whale but did not lower for first middle and latter part fine and pleasant in company with the Braganza

Lat 57° 53' Long 146° 00'

Friday June the 9th 1848

These 24 hours commences with a fine breeze from the Westward with the Braganza steering S.E. by N. middle and latter part calm at 3 P.M. saw right whales lowered 1 boat but done nothing

Saturday June the 10th 1848

These 24 hours commences with a light from S. steering N.E. at 3 P.M. sailed ship to the Westward and saw whale at 4 P.M. lowered 2 boats and chased but did not strike we returned on
