

The Ship Charles - Crew of New Bedford

Saturday June the 17th 1845

These 24

hours commences with a strong breeze from the Eastward steering N.E. at 4 P.M. wore ship heading S. middle part calm with fog and rain latter part much the same at 4.30 cleared up made all sail with a light breeze from the S.E. heading S. at 11.30 wore ship to N.

Sunday June the 18th 1845

These 24 hours

commences with light air from the S.E. steering N. at 6 P.M. double reefed the topsail calm with fog and rain middle part at 7 P.M. wore ship to S. by E. with a light breeze from the N.W. latter part much the same at 6.30 course N.E. by S. with cloudy weather

Monday June the 19th 1845

These 24 hours

commences with a light breeze from the N.W. steering N.E. by E. with clear weather at 4 P.M. saw a ship at 3 P.M. on right whale in sight lowered 3 boats and chased but we could not get on for he was a going to the windward very quick at 7.30 came on board and shortened sail heading N. by W. middle and latter part light breeze from the Westward at 4.30 made all sail steering S.E. by E. at 6 capt her S. at 2

Tuesday June the 20th 1845

These 24 hours commences

with a light breeze from the Westward steering E by S with cloudy weather middle and latter part light breeze and clear weather steering S.E. at 5.30.30 about the mizen topsail to mend it

Wednesday June the 21st 1845

These 24 hours commences

with a light breeze from the Westward steering E by S with clear weather all day. about the fore topsail sail to repair at 4 P.M. bent the mizen topsail at 6 bent the fore topsail sail middle part fine breeze from the S.E. steering by the wind to the Eastward latter part strong breeze from the S.E. with cloudy and rainy weather at 11.30 saw right whale and at 11 lowered 3 boats and we got fast and got the whale

Thursday June the 22nd 1845

These 24 hours

commences with a strong breeze from the S.E. with rainy weather at 2.30 P.M. took the whale alongside and at 3.30 commenced cutting him in our middle part strong breeze from the S.E. at 10 finished cutting and then took in sail latter part more moderate heading to the Northward at 7.30 wore ship and made short sail heading to the Southward
